

Providence Presbyterian Church Family and Friends,

The Session is responsible for the care and day-to-day operations of the physical plant and campus that make up Providence Presbyterian Church. We are also responsible for the quality and integrity of the Worship, ministries, programs and other activities sponsored by and conducted at Providence. To that end we ask members and friends to provide input regarding possible modifications to Worship services offered. The objective is to provide service where:

- All attendees are reasonably comfortable.
- Families have enough room to sit together.
- We always have room for visitors when they show up.
- The quality of the worship experience is the same for every attendee, in any seat in the sanctuary.

Our current capacity in the sanctuary is 121, 158 max people. This assumes:

- Five adults in each of the seventeen pews in the center of the sanctuary. (Industry standard is 20" to 24" seat space per adult, we used 20" which is tight.)
- Six adults in each of the two long choir pews; three in the short choir pew.
- Six adults in each of the two long pews by the organ; five in the pew immediately in front of the organ.
- Four adults on the short pew up front on the left.
- Max capacity at 158 includes a total of 37 combined in the wings. These are two areas in which folks do not want to sit. As reported by many, the quality of the worship experience in the wings leaves much to be desired. We also don't want to put visitors in the wings; that is not offering our best.

Eighty percent of 121/158 seats is 96/126. The "80% rule" states that when your sanctuary is consistently 80% full the church is truly at capacity. People do not want to sit any closer than the space will allow for 80% capacity. Visitors typically do not want to sit up front. When attendance numbers (recorded by the ushers) consistently reflect an average attendance at 80% or higher, the Session will implement an informed, considered plan to alleviate crowding in the sanctuary.
