

Congregational Meeting Called for Sunday, July 14th - The Session has called a congregational meeting for Sunday, July 14th, immediately following the worship service to vote on the Agreement of Dissolution of the Pastoral Relationship between Reverend Jim Davis and Providence Presbyterian Church. All active members are encouraged to be present.

Congregational Vote on Terms of Dismissal - A Congregational Meeting was held on the 23rd of June to consider a motion to approve the Terms of Dismissal from New Hope Presbytery and the PC(USA). There were 132 active members present. The motion was approved by 95% of those voting (125 in favor, 6 opposed, 1 vote invalidated). On Saturday, October 26th, New Hope Presbytery will vote on the Terms of Dismissal at First Presbyterian Church in Smithfield. If the terms are approved by a majority vote of the presbytery, Providence will be dismissed to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church.

USO Collections - During the month of July we are going to collect items to be donated to the USO center at Fort Bragg in Fayetteville. Please place your items in the container outside the Upper Fellowship Hall from July 1 through July 31. All contributions will be delivered to the USO after the last Sunday in July.
