DONATIONS DROP-OFF DETAILS

Hurricane Florence has come and gone and left devastation in her path. There are families and businesses that will be suffering varying degrees of hardship for days and months to come. Providence Presbyterian Church (PPC) has volunteered to be a donations drop-off location now through the month of October.

NC Food Bank prescribed donations received at PPC will be delivered to the NC Food Bank Raleigh location after Oct 28.

- **Items Needed – (please NO glass containers):**
 - **Non-Perishable (non-refrigerated) Food Items**
 - Including but not limited to individual containers of fruits, meats, canned goods, canned meats, canned fruits, peanut butter, crackers, granola bars.
 - **Bottled Water**
 - **Cleaning Supplies**
 - Sponges, rubber gloves, dish rags, Clorox.
 - **Paper Products**
 - Paper towels, various disposal hygiene products, disposal diapers, “Wet Wipes.”

- **Drop-Off Dates/Hours:**
 - Saturdays in October – 6th, 13th, 20th, 27th.
 - Hours – 9:00am to 1:00pm.

- **Drop-Off Location:**
 - Providence Presbyterian Church, at the covered drive-thru on the west end of the building. Enter the property at the driveway on Old Fairgrounds Road, just west of the traffic light at Hwy 210 / Old Fairgrounds Road. For GPS purposes, the church address is 14664 NC Hwy 210, Angier. Our mailing address is Angier, but we are located about a mile west of the Hwy 210 / Hwy 50 intersection in McGee’s Crossroads.
 - There will be members of the church at the drop-off location to assist with off-loading donations from your vehicles.
