July Session Highlights

Providence Presbyterian Church conducted a stated Session meeting on July 8, 2013 beginning at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Present were Moderator Reverend Jim Davis, and Elders Stephanie Bagley, Nathan Dry, John Kopanski, Wayne Lamm, Gary Phillips, Atlee Roberts, and Kristy Stephenson. Excused were Elders Robert Joyner and Jeffrey Wood. Due to the clerk's excused absence, John Kopanski was designated to record the minutes. A quorum was declared and Rev. Davis opened the meeting with prayer. Nathan Dry presented the devotional about approaching others with love rather than prejudging them.

There was no correspondence presented at this meeting. Committee reports were made from the pastor and seven of the standing committees of Session. Reports from the Personnel and Property Committee were not presented. The following actions were approved by Session:

- The minutes of the stated Session meeting conducted on June 10, 2013 were reviewed and approved.
- Youth Group leaders were presented, but not approved since the Christian Education committee chair was not present. It was tabled until the next Session meeting.
- The June Treasurer's Report was reviewed and approved.
- A congregational meeting was called for Sunday, July 28, 2013 for the purpose of voting to move forward with securing a loan for the purpose of construction of new facilities that include a fellowship hall and class rooms.
- A new communion service set will be purchased.
- A revised worship format for children's church will be implemented in September of 2013 and will include: singing a hymn, reciting the Lord's Prayer, reading scripture, children's prayers, bible lessons that include activities, and a benediction.

It was also reported that communion was served to shut-ins of the congregation on June 19, 2013, with Rev. Davis assisted by Elder Wayne Lamm. The next stated Session meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 12, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Rev. Davis closed the meeting with prayer.


