From the Pastor's Study...

The month of March brings in an early Easter this year. March for many of us means one last chance of snow, the return of many birds which have flown south for the winter, the beginning of the season of Lent, turning our clocks ahead, or perhaps even March Madness of NCAA basketball. Whether you are an ACC fan or care little about sports, March is the seasonal marker for change. The end of winter and the beginning of spring ... the end of the grey colors of a cold season are contrasted with the promise of a green and colorful spring.

March, in terms of Christianity, means an exceptional time of year. For many Christians the season of Lent is apex of the church calendar. Lent is meant to be a time for reflection and meditation on our devotion to God who is devoted in care and redemption of our souls. It is a time of preparation to celebrate God's marvelous redemption at Easter, and the resurrected life that we live, and hope for, as Christians.

This month's scripture is Psalm 67 which proclaims "... our God has blessed us. May God continue to bless us ...". In this passage we also encounter the phrase "*May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us*", a familiar phrase used several times in the Bible. In our busy lives we often forget that our God blesses us in a multitude of ways. We speak of good or bad luck or fate, but the truth is whether we experience joys or sorrows, elation or devastation, love or hate – God is beside us through it all. Jesus calls us to follow God's will for our lives throughout the good and the bad.

February Session Highlights

The stated session meeting on Monday, February 11, 2013 was held at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Present were Moderator Reverend Jim Davis, Elders Stephanie Bagley, Nathan Dry, Robert Joyner, John Kopanski, Wayne Lamm, Gary Phillips, Atlee Roberts, Kristy Stephenson, and Jeffrey Wood. A quorum was declared and Rev. Davis opened the meeting with prayer.

After the opening of the meeting, Tom Nelms spoke to the Session concerning communion preparation. Rev. Davis presented the devotional titled "Send the Light" taken from Philippians 2: 12-18. There was no correspondence.

The minutes of the stated Session meeting conducted on January 14, 2013 were reviewed and approved. The Session agreed that, whenever possible, committee reports will be prepared by committee chairpersons and distributed via email to Session members for review before each meeting. The treasurer's reports will not be distributed via email before Session meetings.

Committee reports were made from each of the nine standing committees of Session with the following actions approved by Session:

• A movie day planned for Sunday, August 18 that will include an ice-cream social.

• An adult Bible Study will begin to meet during Pioneer Clubs meetings beginning in March, Nathan Dry agreed to teach.

•Vacation Bible School is scheduled for July 28 - August 3, the curriculum used will be "Kingdom Rock" by Group Publishing.

• Kathy Ryals and Elaine Wood will be allowed to use the church's wheelchair as needed.

• The January 2013 financial statement (including capital campaign fund) was reviewed and approved.

• A letter addressed to Brian Stewart of First Citizens Bank approving Mr. Wood, Clerk of Session, and Kristy Stephenson, Elder of Finance, to have full access to the safe deposit box; and Ann Benson, Collections Treasurer, and Ann Stephenson, Accounting Treasurer, have access to the checking account ending in 0641; and Ann Benson, Collections Treasurer, Wayne Lamm, Accounting Treasurer, and Kristy Stephenson, Accounting Treasurer, have access to the checking account ending in 1441 was signed by all members of Session.

• Two preliminary bids for the architectural plans for the new building have been received by the Long-Range Planning Committee.

• The Long-Range Planning Committee will send recently joined members of the church a letter concerning the capital campaign effort with a contribution card and video included.

• The following persons will serve on the Personnel Committee for the year 2013: Pete Booth, Beth Breeden, Steve Nordan and Nadine Reed.

• Laura McLamb, Clerk of Session of 2012 will complete the 2012 Statistical Report. Ms. McLamb also will attend the area cluster meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Smithfield, NC on March 2 to present the church books for audit.

• The following topics presented by the worship committee will be the foundation of the Kids Krusade services over the next several months: Memorization of the New Testament books of the Bible, Old Testament books of the Bible, Ten Commandments, Beatitudes, Fruit of the Spirit, Deuteronomy 6:5, Psalm 23, John 3:16, John 14:6, Romans 3:23, Philippians 4:13, Lord's Prayer, Apostle's Creed, and Church Etiquette.
