From the Pastor's Study...

Question ... How do you know it is truly Spring time in North Carolina?

Answer .... When it snowed last week - this week everything is covered in yellow - and next week the thermometer will read 90.

I remember growing up in New Bern where all the trees, with few exceptions, were tall yellow pine trees. The view from the roof tops were forest green long leaf pines for as far as my eyes could see. As a child I can recall days in Spring where it looked as if it were raining yellow mist ... this meant that I would have an allergic reaction in the form of asthma or hayfever. As the years progressed I learned to use the yellow fog of Spring as a sign to begin medications that reduced my allergic reactions.

So often in life there are signs that foreshadow things and events to come. Dark clouds in the sky often mean rain is coming, ozone smell in the air can mean lightening is eminent, the absence of the noise of the creatures of nature often foretell earthquakes or tornadoes, and there many other signs in this world if we take the time to understand them. All too often we fear the things we do not understand and try to control the things we do. This month's scripture passage is from the Apostle Paul's letter to the church in Rome. Paul writes about things seen and things unseen in this world where we are reminded of the Holy Spirit's intercessory power in our lives and hearts.

This month as we come together in worship, fellowship, discipleship and study of God's word may we ask our LORD God to convict our hearts

<sup>22</sup> We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; <sup>23</sup> and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. 24 For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? <sup>25</sup> But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. <sup>26</sup> Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. 27 And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

## **April Session Highlights**

Providence Presbyterian Church conducted a stated session meeting on April 8, 2013 beginning at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Present were Moderator Reverend Jim Davis, and Elders Stephanie Bagley, John Kopanski, Wayne Lamm, Gary Phillips, Atlee Roberts, Kristy Stephenson, and Jeffrey Wood. Excused were Elders Nathan Dry and Robert Joyner. A quorum was declared and Rev. Davis opened the meeting with prayer. Jeffrey Wood presented the devotional titled "A Shadow of a Doubt" taken from Matthew 11: 2-3.

Correspondence included an Easter card from Virginia Moore and a letter from Dr. Jim Ferry of First Presbyterian Church, in Garner, NC introducing himself as the Committee on Ministry liaison for Providence. The minutes of the stated Session meeting conducted on March 11, 2013 were reviewed and approved.

Committee reports were made from eight of the standing committees of Session. No Personnel Committee report was presented. The following actions were approved by Session:

- The VBS decorations committee will start decorating classrooms, the fellowship hall and a backdrop in the sanctuary beginning Sunday afternoon, July 21st.
- The March 2013 treasurer's report (including capital campaign fund) was reviewed and approved.
- The Session agreed to table the review the church rolls until the May Session meeting.
- Cemetery plot numbers 98 and 109 be transferred to Jerry L. Johnson and plot numbers 106 and 107 transferred to Charlotte Johnson Duncan from the John L Johnson estate.
- A special committee was appointed to research existing cemetery by-laws and recommend to Session an updated set of rules to govern the use and upkeep of the cemetery. The committee is to include Gary Phillips, chairperson, David Nelms, Jimmy Stuart and Kent Walton.
- The organist will chime the hour precisely at 11:00 a.m. to mark the beginning of worship.
- Beth Breeden is to become the Children's Church Coordinator beginning September 1, 2013.
- Worship committee will research the cost of a new communion set to address the needs of growing church attendance. The communion roster for elder assignments will be updated for two additional servers of bread and wine, and an elder assigned to assist the pastor in serving communion to the shut-ins on a quarterly basis.
- Rev. Davis will take two days of vacation on April 25th and 28th, and take vacation from June 24th until July 7th. The pulpit will be filled by George Dudley on April 28th and July 7th. The pulpit supply for June 30th is yet to be determined.

The Pastor submitted a report that detailed congregational concerns and many of the upcoming events at Providence. Rev. Davis will attend the Sprunt Lectures in Richmond, VA scheduled for April 30 through May 3 as a continuing education opportunity. Also, the Pastor reported that the next two Presbytery meetings will be on July 23 at White Memorial in Raleigh and on October 26, 2013 at First Presbyterian in New Bern.

There was no old business discussed at this meeting. The next stated session meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 13, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Rev. Davis closed the meeting with prayer.
