Providence Presbyterian Church conducted a stated session meeting on August 12, 2013 beginning at 7:00 p.m. at the church. Present were moderator Reverend Jim Davis, and elders Stephanie Bagley, Nathan Dry, Robert Joyner, John Kopanski, Gary Phillips, Atlee Roberts and Jeffrey Wood. Excused were elders Wayne Lamm and Kristy Stephenson. A quorum was declared and Rev. Davis opened the meeting with prayer. John Kopanski presented the devotional titled "Reflections on Windows" taken from Psalm 34:1-10.

Correspondence included a thank you card received from McGee's Crossroads Alanon in appreciation for the use of the fellowship hall for hosting a district meeting in June; a brochure advertising "Growing Together", a Christian education event from New Hope Presbytery; a letter from the Board of Pensions informing of changes to the PCUSA medical plan; a letter from the Fellowship of Presbyterians in appreciation of Providence's support; a letter from the Presbytery of New Hope informing that session minutes and rolls/registers for Providence were approved without exception at the presbytery's stated meeting on July 23rd.

Reports were received from Christian Education, Congregational Care, Fellowship, Finance, Long-Range Planning, Mission and Outreach, Personnel and Worship Committees and from the pastor. The following actions were approved by Session:

- The minutes of the stated Session meeting conducted on July 8, 2013 were reviewed and approved.
- The minutes of the congregational meeting conducted on July 28, 2013 were reviewed and approved.
- The July Treasurer's Report was reviewed and approved.
- Sunday School teacher appreciation will be September 8 during worship.
- The Providence Youth will sponsor a craft sale on October 19th as a fundraiser to support youth activities.
- The roster of Sunday School teachers for 2013-2014 were presented and approved.
- The roster of Pioneer Clubs leaders for 2013-2014 were presented and approved.
- Recent gifts totaling \$2,700 will be used toward the balance of Vacation Bible School expenses and the purchase of the new communion set with any remaining amount to be moved to the capital campaign account.
- A building finance chairperson will be appointed to form a committee to finalize the loan for Phase 1 and Phase 2 facilities and any ancillary items that are required to complete the construction of these phases.
- The long-range building committee will begin and complete any ancillary items required for the proper completion of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 projects.
- Homecoming Sunday will be designated the "Groundbreaking Ceremony" for the Phase 1 and Phase 2 construction.
