From the Pastor's Study...

Easter comes late this year on April 20th and this gives us time to meditate on what our Lord God has done in our lives this year. We will come together and celebrate the culmination of the season of Lent. Easter marks the end of Lent and recalls the Passover meal Jesus shared with the disciples in the upper room. The Hebrews in Jesus' day as well as today prepare what is known as a Seder Meal to celebrate Passover.

The Seder meal...

Seder in Hebrew means "order" and it is a prescribed ritual of conducting the first Passover evening meal - where the adults teach the children the meaning of Passover by reciting the history of Exodus from Egypt. It's a simple meal comprised of: Vegetables (Karpas), salt water, bitter vegetables, a dressing or fruit paste, boiled egg, roasted lamb, wine and unleavened bread (matzah bread).

- Karpas (vegetable): Is a vegetable (usually parsley or celery, sometimes boiled potato) is the first thing to eat. It should be dipped in salt water (sometimes in vinegar or lime juice), then the excess of water is shaken off and the vegetable itself is eaten.

Karpas represents the humble beginnings of Jewish people and the food they ate in Egypt as slaves.

- Salt water: is perceived as tears their Jewish ancestors shed because of hardships of slavery.
- Maror (bitter vegetable): Maror traditionally represented by horseradish, either grated or as a whole root. This vegetable symbolizes the bitter harsh living of Jewish people in Egypt.

April Scripture Passage

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ² And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. 4 For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. 5 But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here: for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. 7 Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' - Chazeret (second bitter vegetable): Romaine or endive lettuce is often used as the second bitter vegetable. Both bitter vegetables are eaten with Charoset: the first one is dipped in it and the second is used to make a "sandwich" with Matza and Charoset. Not all Jewish communities use the second bitter vegetable during Seder.
- Charoset: is a paste made from tart apples, dates, nuts, honey, wine or grape juice and spices such as cinnamon and ginger. The mixture looks like clay and represents the mortar which Jewish people used to build cities for Pharaoh.
- Beitzah: is a boiled or roasted egg. Egg represents the reminder about festive sacrifice brought to the Temple in Jerusalem and then eaten. Since Temple was destroyed the egg serves as a reminder about this loss. The shell represents the hardened heart of Pharaoh and also symbolizes eternal life for it's shape shows no sign of beginning or ending.
- Zeroah: is a piece of roasted shank bone of a lamb (sometimes chicken wing) and represents the helping hand of God and the traditional sacrifice of a lamb before Exodus from Egypt as well as following sacrifices at the Temple until it was destroyed. Zeroah is usually not eaten but serves as a reminder of the Passover miracle and liberation from slavery.
- Wine: Represents our sanctification coming from God only, from whom all good and righteous blessings come, we can be made righteous only because God is righteous. Joy rejoice in our Lord God who is creator, judge, and redeemer.
- Elijah who did not see death but was taken up to heaven alive in a mighty wind.

Praise – in a God who seeks a relationship with us ("You will be my people and I will be your God" Exodus 6:7).

- Matzah: the unleavened bread made as the Hebrews left Egypt for there was no time for the bread to rise from the yeast.

This is the context where the last supper of Christ or the "Lord's Supper" unfolds. Isn't it fitting that our celebration of the Lord's Supper which symbolizes the very nature of our own salvation takes place within the story of God saving the Hebrews. The Passover meal that Jesus shared with the twelve disciples in the upper room was no ordinary Seder meal ... but the Passover for all time! God saves the Jews from Pharaoh and gives them the Ten Commandments ... God incarnate, Jesus, saves the world and gives us the higher commandment of LOVE.

Our Lord God is so good and blesses us in so many ways. May God bless us with a deeper understanding of God's love through forgiveness purchased through the blood of Jesus. Please continue to support our church family and it's ministries in your thoughts, prayers, and actions.
