From the Pastor's Study...

I remember when my parents rented a Winnebago and we embarked upon our family vacation to Disney World. It was the month of June and we had never experienced travel as family in a R.V. I remember being filled with so much anticipation of what it might be like to travel to a place I had only seen on television in a vehicle that I saw more as a space ship than a R.V. Once we began the journey we quickly settled into our new way to travel and view the world. I was a wideeyed eleven year old filled with excitement and wonder at the thought of going somewhere for the purpose of having fun.

The trip lived up to my expectations. We were introduced to K.O.A.s (Kamp-grounds Of America) with swimming pools and putt-putt courses almost every night. We managed to stop at many other attractions along the way as we listened to our newly purchased 8-track tapes which served as the theme music for that summer. I remember holding my father's hand many times as we explored Disney World, Marineland, Busch Gardens, Silver Springs, Cyprus Gardens and many other places. We all took plenty of pictures that summer and spoke of that family outing for many years afterward. It is a memory that rests fondly in my mind.

This month's scripture comes from the Gospel of John. Chapter 14:11-17 captures the response of Jesus regarding the disciples' questions as they try to understand Jesus explaining his ensuing departure. The disciples hear the words of Jesus going to the Father and respond with excitement and anxiety – where they are hoping to go with Jesus on what they perceive to be a glorious trip. May our Lord God's will be evident in our words and deeds in the midst of discerning the next chapter of ministry and mission for the Body of Christ at our church.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Providence Presbyterian Church conducted a stated session meeting on May 12, 2014, at 7:00pm at the church. The elders present were Pete Booth, Beth Breeden, Wayne Lamm, David Nelms, Kristy Stephenson, Margie Taylor, Jeffrey Wood, Nathan Dry and Steve Nordan..

- A letter of transfer request was received from Broken Wing Fellowship Church for the transfer of Kim Byrd's membership. The session agreed to the request and the clerk will send a letter.
- Children's Christian Education committee chair Beth Breeden discussed her committee's look at the LOGOS program to replace Pioneers Club for the fall. She presented what they felt were the best points of the program and how they could supplement any missing aspects. The session then approved the adoption of the LOGOS model for the 2014-15 year, with further evaluation of the program after that first year.
- The session also approved the change to the "Grow Proclaim Serve" curriculum for the preschool Sunday school.
- The session approved the updated Fellowship Hall rules and rental agreement.
