From the Pastor's Study...

In June's scripture passage, Matthew 18:1-7, Matthew writes "4 Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. 5Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." In response to the disciples' question: Who will be the greatest in the kingdom of heaven amongst them? Jesus speaks of four things: three actions and one condition - 1- change, 2- humility, 3- being welcoming, 4- and not being the cause for others to spiritually stumble.

Change is so often the hardest thing we have to do ... and old habits die hard. True spiritual change is transformation – becoming a new creature centered on God and God's plan for our lives and thereby allowing the old self to die.

True humility is the condition of being willing to step out of a world centered around ourselves and allow God to be the main focus of our lives.

The act of welcoming someone is a facet of hospitality, following Christ's example is a mission of hospitality to declare God's redeeming love.
