From the Pastor's Study...

God is so awesome! Once again growing church has ended the month with celebration of Jesus Christ in the form of Vacation Bible School. It is such a blessing and true joy to share the love and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ to those in our community and our church family. We would like to extend a big ol'joyful *Thank you!* and *well done* to all who made this year's Vacation Bible School an awesome display of God's grace, love, great food, fun in the sun, kickball, and proclamation of the love of Jesus Christ in our lives.

This month's scripture passage comes from the Gospel according to Luke and the new beginning of seeing and hearing of the God of Abraham through the words of Jesus the Christ. Jesus charges his disciples with a full development of the higher law of love. Such teaching found in the New Testament marks a new understanding of God as much more than revealed in the Law of Moses. Jesus redefined what a relationship with God is to be for the Jews and the Gentiles. Belief or faith in our God of unimaginable love, grace and power is the message Jesus proclaims.

God's higher law of love is described by Jesus to include, but not limited to, what Luke chronicles in Chapter 6 as: "love your enemies ... do good ... expecting nothing in return" because even God "... is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked" and so Jesus points to what is often humanity's greatest challenge – "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you."

Today's church of Jesus Christ has so many opportunities to engage the complex culture it finds itself in. Our Lord God has given Providence Presbyterian Church many opportunities to reach out to

35 But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. I Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. 36 Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. 37 "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; 38 give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back." 39 He also told them a parable: "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit?




CHILDREN'S WORSHIP
