From the Pastor's Study...

Greetings in the name of our LORD and Savior! Easter is upon us and we celebrate a risen Savior in Jesus as Christ. As we join together in fellowship during the Easter celebrations this month, it is important to share the Peace of Christ realized in a crucified *but* risen Son of God. Please join us for worship and fellowship - Maundy Thursday Communion Service, the children's Easter fun on Saturday 15th, the sunrise Easter Service at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church at 7 a.m., Easter Sunday Cantata and the other opportunities this month. In this time of celebration, may we share God's love with each other – let us make time to take time with those God places in our path to share the true source of our hope and joy in this life.

This month's scripture comes from 2 Corinthians 5:17-20 where Paul writes to the church at Corinth for a second time to remind the church of then and now that Jesus died for all humanity ... all of us ... not just the good ones ... or bad ones ... but all! Jesus is the paradigm shift which Paul expresses "17 ... everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" and "19 ... in Christ God was reconciling the world ... " For our relationship with God has been not only repaired but improved through Jesus Christ.

We have been given a great gift – to be able to live unencumbered in this life – we are not sinless ... au contraire!! ... we are as sinful as the world around us ... but entering into a relationship with Jesus Christ with our eyes open allows us to see everything differently. For we live in relationship with God and therefore see our own sin as detestable before the eyes of God and REPENT! Paul proclaims "20 ... we are ambassadors for Christ ...", for a real relationship with our Lord God is healthy, dynamic, and proactive! This is our new paradigm ... proclaiming the will of God for ourselves and all God's children ... and praying for our eyes to be open to the possibilities.





Benefits of Church for the Senior in Your Life

For some, growing older presents a lot of challenges. Health deteriorates, spouses pass away and life slows down tremendously. These changes leave many seniors feeling depressed, isolated and hopeless. These feelings can lead to even more pressing issues. It's very difficult to watch a loved one transition into their golden years being unhappy, however, something can be done about it. Studies show that seniors who attend church regularly are less likely to have feelings of depression. Here a few reasons why older adults should foster a spiritual practice.

Church provides fellowship

Many seniors live alone or in an assisted living facility, which can lead to isolation. Failing to manage social connections causes issues such as poor emotional health, high blood pressure and decreased physical health. To combat these problems, take your senior loved one to church regularly. Developing this habit will contribute to their psychological and physical wellness because they have the opportunity to socialize with others.

Music makes people happy

Music is one of the first thoughts that come to mind when church is mentioned. Group singing is an exhilarating experience that alters the physical and emotional landscape of it's participants. As your loved one sings with the congregation, endorphins and oxytocin are released, which alleviates stress and anxiety. Feelings of trust and bonding are by-products of oxytocin, which lessens depression and loneliness.

Church offers a great support system

Church members are often thought of as family because they tend to look out for one another. When friends are sick, they show up with dinner and they lend an ear to those who need to talk. For those growing in age, the support of a group of people is much needed for their health. A study conducted by researchers at University of Wisconsin-Madison found that religious people are happier with their lives because of the sense of belonging they get from their church. Results concluded that 28% of individuals who attended a religious service every week were extremely satisfied with their life, as opposed to less than 20 percent of people who did not attend services.

Promotes routine

Advancing to the later years of life is a very disorienting experience. Life no longer flows as it once had which leads to confusion and resentment for many seniors. Attending church weekly can help bring balance and routine back into their lives. Routines are encouraged among seniors because it reduces stress and increases feelings of safety and security.

Strengthens their faith

Later in life, many adults feel out of control of their bodies. Some are riddled with disease, while others struggle to move around independently. During this time, seniors begin to feel resentment toward the aging process. Faith has the ability to have a positive impact on mood and mental health and a strong practice enables them to release control and embrace this phase of life. Churches promote the message of faith and staying hopeful through trials. Learning to rely on faith gives people the strength needed to pull through. Seniors instructed in this spiritual practice will have a sense of purpose while connecting to something greater than themselves.

Aging can be a process that is hard to accept. As a caretaker of a senior, you may feel responsible to help restore their quality of life. Routine church attendance increases emotional health by providing the support that most seniors feel they no longer have. Lonely seniors are more likely to decline and die faster, so keeping them social is a must. Church is the one area that provides room for continuing growth because although their physical health is waning, their spirit can still flourish.

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, March 13, 2017

Separation from PCUSA

- Communication was received from the Presbytery Discernment Team (PDT) of New Hope Presbytery regarding the next steps in the Gracious Dismissal procedure.
- Motion was unanimously passed to confirm the Session's continuing desire to seek dismissal from New Hope Presbytery and PCUSA.

Action Items

- 1. <u>Youth Christian Education Motion passed in early March by email</u> The Session approved Ft. Caswell Retreat and Conference Center for the youth retreat this summer. The program is "Way, Truth, and Life." Dates for the retreat are July 17-22, 2017, and the retreat is open to 7th through 12th graders.
- 2. <u>Request from Long Range Planning</u> Clarification was sought on a timeframe for a future fundraising effort to pay off the building loan. Following discussion, the Session asked that the sub-committee set a target of paying off the loan in 9 years.
- 3. <u>Motion from Christian Education approved</u> Sue Bryant approved as the Sunday School Superintendent.
- 4. <u>Children's Christian Education</u> Vickie Faircloth presented for approval a waiver of liability form to be required for the LOGOS celebration this year. The form is one used for this purpose previously. By consensus, use of the form was approved. Vickie also reported that we are in compliance per insurance standards with the number of teachers in each Sunday School class.
- 5. <u>Motion from Personnel approved</u> Motion to adjust the weights on the pastoral evaluation as follows: Worship Service to 37.5% from 42.5; Congregational Care to 30% from 20%; Leadership to 15% from 17.5%; Administration to 10% from 12.5%.

Committee Updates

- <u>Children's Christian Education</u> An Easter Egg hunt will be held on April 15th at 10 AM. Annah Creech will spearhead the event.
- Youth Christian Education
 - 1. New Sunday School material for the High School youth has been received. A motion to accept and use the material was approved.
 - 2. Prior plans for a Youth mission trip to Virginia Beach have been cancelled. The committee is reviewing alternatives. The date for the trip remains June 18-24, 2017.
- <u>Congregational Care</u> Kent Walton reported on security issues identified during a walkthrough of the church with Israel Morrow. The committee will prepare a motion for the next stated meeting in April, including a detailed Safety Protocol for approval and implementation.
- <u>Finance</u> Sam Stephenson presented a detailed financial report updated through February, 2017. A motion was approved to use the \$2,433.76 received from the sale of the Christmas Cantata CD to pay down the principle on the building loan.
- <u>Personnel</u> The Session agreed to ask David Nelms to set up an electronic suggestion box accessible through the church website. The contents will be accessible by all Elders.
- <u>Property</u> The committee reported that an estimate has been received on costs to correct audio issues in the sanctuary. A detailed proposal will be requested for consideration.

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, March 13, 2017 – (Continued from page 7)

Pastor's Report - Rev. Davis reported that Eunice and Steve Newnam will join the congregation as new members during the worship service on Sunday, March 19, 2017.

New Business - Stephanie Bagley reminded the Session that they would soon receive copies of the pastor's evaluation form. The joint meeting of the Personnel Committee and the Session to review the evaluation will be in April.

Next stated session meeting will be held April 10, 2017 at 7pm.

Update on Gracious Dismissal Process – The Session received a communication from the Presbytery Discernment Team (PDT) of New Hope Presbytery on March 8 regarding the timeframe and next steps in the process of separation from PCUSA. The following is a summary:

- 1. Based on the overwhelming unity expressed by the Providence congregation at its meeting with the PDT in January, the PDT will recommend to the Presbytery at its next meeting (July 25, 2017) that a Presbytery Engagement Team (PET) be named to negotiate the terms of dismissal with the Special Committee of the Congregation (SCC) from Providence. The SCC from Providence was elected by the Session in January and consists of Steve Nordan, Kristy Stephenson, Jeff Wood and Mary Ann Booth.
- 2. The process requires that the Session confirm that it wants to continue with the process of separation from PCUSA. On March 13, the Session voted unanimously to continue pursuing dismissal. The Clerk of Session informed the PDT of the vote on March 16.
- 3. The PDT will send a request for information form to the Session to be completed and returned to the PDT in advance of the July presbytery meeting.
- 4. Following the naming of the PET at the July presbytery meeting, the PET and SCC teams will meet with the objective of developing terms of dismissal with which both parties agree.
- 5. A Congregational vote will be held no sooner than five (5) weeks after the teams agree on the terms of dismissal. At least 50% of the Providence active membership is required to be present in order for the vote to be held. Absentee votes are not allowed. Ballots will be counted immediately upon completion of the vote. If 65% of the vote is in favor of the terms of the agreement, the terms of dismissal are approved. Failure to approve the terms ends the process and Providence remains in PCUSA.
- 6. At the next scheduled presbytery meeting following a positive congregational vote and at least 30 days after that vote - New Hope Presbytery will vote on dismissing Providence to another Presbyterian denomination.

The earliest that Providence could be dismissed from PCUSA is the October 28, 2017 meeting of New Hope Presbytery. The window is very narrow between the July 25 and October 28 presbytery meetings. The Session has informed the PDT that it wants to complete the process in time for the Presbytery to vote on dismissal in October. Because of the built-in waiting periods, it is possible that the Presbytery will not vote on the terms of dismissal until the February 2018 meeting.

The Session voted last year to recommend transfer to ECO, a Presbyterian denomination whose beliefs and tenets align with ours. In the coming months, work will begin on completing the application for transfer to ECO. For information regarding ECO, log on to http://eco-pres.org/

As the process moves forward, every effort will be made to keep the congregation of Providence informed. If at any time that you have questions, please contact a member of the Session or the SCC.
