

Changes to the Bulletin – The Session is changing the way the church financial information is reported on the back of the Sunday bulletin. Complete monthly financial statements will continue to be available in the narthex. Your Session hopes that these changes will provide more helpful information. Going forward, you will see these figures reported:

- Year-to-Date General Fund Receipts The total will update each week and provide you with an "at-a-glimpse" update of how well we are meeting our yearly financial needs
- Year-to-Date General Fund Expenses This figure will be updated once a month as the total of previous month's expenses are known (figures for January will not be available until Feb. 19)
- Prior month's General Fund Receipts Updated the first Sunday of the month
- Prior month's General Fund Expenses Updated as available each month
- Total for current month's General Fund Receipts Like the Year-to-Date total, this updates weekly and provides a quick assessment of how well we are managing to meet our monthly expenses. On the first Sunday of the month, the bulletin figure will be \$0.00
- General Fund Receipts for the Previous Sunday
- Capital Reserve Account Balance
- Current Loan Balance
- Attendance at Sunday School and Worship

Minutes of the Session – Beginning with the February newsletter, the Session will begin publishing highlights of the minutes from the previous month in an effort to provide greater transparency to the workings of your church leadership. Full text of the minutes are open and available to members of the church upon request. Due to space limitation, the report in the newsletter will be restricted to highlights of the most pertinent activities of each meeting. Please reach out to members of the Session for more information or clarification.



Gracious Dismissal – A Process – Gracious Dismissal is the name given to the process by which churches leave the PCUSA denomination to join another reformed (Presbyterian) denomination. Many of you have asked about the process.

The process for Providence Presbyterian Church began last September. The Session informed the Presbytery of New Hope that our congregation desired to leave PCUSA in order to join a Presbyterian denomination that holds to the same traditional, conservative theological tenets that we do. The steps of the process are defined by our Presbytery, New Hope.

Representatives of New Hope - the Presbyterian Discernment Team (PDT) - met with our pastor and Session in December and learned that the Session is unanimous in its desire to pursue dismissal from PCUSA. On Sunday, January 29, the PDT met with members of the congregation to answer questions and hear your perspective about staying with or leaving PCUSA.

The process now depends on what the PDT hears from you. It is possible that we will move to an abbreviated process. If the shortened process is decided on by the PDT, the next step would be an official vote by members of the church, overseen by the representatives of the Presbytery. A quorum of at least 50% of church members is required for the vote to take place. Assuming that at least 65% of members vote in favor of leaving PCUSA, a Special Committee of the Church will begin negotiating the terms of dismissal with representatives of the Presbytery.

The Session wants to keep you up to date on the process and will continue sharing information with you as the next steps are determined. You are urged to contact a Session member (posted on the back of the Sunday bulletin) with your questions and comments.

In this as in all things, the Lord is our Shephard and we trust Him to guide us.



Highlights of the Minutes of PPC's Stated Session Meeting January 16, 2017

Action Items

- 1. Finance Sub-committee Recommendation a plan for improved communication by informing the congregation regarding the church's financial status was approved by session. Key components include changes to how financial information is reported in the bulletin and a letter to the congregation that includes a financial analysis with a follow-up Q&A meeting on February 12, 2017. The Q&A will be held following worship in the new fellowship hall.
- 2. Denomination Transition
 - a. <u>Gracious Dismissal Negotiating Team</u> The New Hope Presbytery Gracious Dismissal Process was reviewed and discussed. The Session agreed to form a special committee to serve as our negotiating team was discussed as an item that needs immediate attention by the Session.
 - b. ECO Application to Transfer Membership from PCUSA Session is reviewing the application form and process of transitioning to the ECO.
- 3. Review and Approval of Pastor's Objectives –Personnel Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 26, to review
- 4. Board of Directors (BOD) the new BOD officers were nominated by the Session: President - Mary Ann Booth; Vice President - John Kopanski; Secretary - Dave Collier; Treasurer -Sam Stephenson; congregational meeting to elect BOD to be announced in the upcoming bulletin.
- 5. Church Manual Discussion was held regarding the need to update and complete the Church Manual. It was agreed that each committee is responsible for development and maintenance its section and table of contents. Committee sections and updates shall be sent to the church secretary.

Adult Christian Education - Atlee Roberts reported that congregation members had a good time taking down Christmas decorations

Congregational Care - No meeting in January. Kent Walton reported that Donna Walker seeks approval to start a walking group at the church. Approved by consensus.

<u>Finance</u> – Session approved the December 2016 year-end financial report. Sam noted that receipts in December were particularly good and larger than the monthly expenses. Total expenses for 2016 were \$290,485, \$14,693 under budget.

Boy Scout Troop 210 - Session approved Boy Scout Troop's purchase of utility trailer to be kept on church property near the Manse.
