
FELLOWSHIP TIME REMINDER



Dear Providence Family and Friends,

In early 2017 the Session asked the Long Range Planning Committee to explore various opportunities to expand seating accommodations during worship here at Providence Presbyterian Church. During our Capital Campaign our consultants, Perkinson & Associates, informed us that a sanctuary is perceived by visitors to be full when it has reached 80% capacity. We are joyful that consistent recent trends indicate our worship service has reached 80% capacity. In May, Long Range Planning reported out to Session with a recommendation to take the worship service to the Upper Fellowship Hall. Session accepted that recommendation, and announced the decision the following Sunday during worship service on May 21st. Worship, Property and Fellowship Committees were to take the summer to work out the logistics, to implement the plan for a trial period to run Sept through Dec 2017.

The feedback in response to this announcement has been passionate. Many good points were raised both for and against such a plan. We appreciate any constructive input that helps inform decision making. Upon review of information known to date, the Session has decided to rescind the motion to implement this trial worship service in the Upper Fellowship Hall this fall.

Currently ushers are reporting visitors showing up and leaving because they don't see enough seating when they first enter the sanctuary. One visiting family has, on more than one occasion, been split up when they were seated. Whether the sanctuary is actually full, elbow-to-elbow, is not the measurement determines max capacity. The measurement is dictated by human nature; folks do not want to sit elbow-to-elbow, especially first-time visitors. Nor do they want to walk up the aisle and sit in the front row.

Therefore, to accommodate visitors sent by our Lord the following will be implemented:

- 1. Church family who may normally sit in the middle of the sanctuary are lovingly requested to be willing to sit in the wings, and to populate that space first.
- 2. The third row, both sides of the aisle, from the rear of the sanctuary will be reserved as a Visitors' Row. Please honor the reserve signs and leave this space for visitors and their families.
- 3. Church family who are willing to wait and fill available seating in the sanctuary or experience worship service in the over flow room (Lower Fellowship Hall) are asked to congregate in the back by the mail center for ushers' directions.

Your hospitality and assistance in implementing these no-cost, short term steps will be a blessing to our new visitors.

Providence is growing as we prayed it would with the addition of the Christian Education wing and the Upper Fellowship Hall. As our Lord continues to add to our numbers we will need to revisit the issue of whether we add an early service in the sanctuary, or go to one service in the Upper Fellowship Hall. When Session has accumulated data that supports the need for a change to accommodate more people, we will bring the issue before the congregation for input.

Together, cooperating in the Spirit of God's Love, we can provide a worship experience that will be meaningful to all that enter Christ's church here at Providence. Our mission as Christians is to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to welcome all those with whom God is blessing us. Our challenge is to provide a welcoming space for visitors, family and friends, where Christian love, fellowship, and faith can flourish.

Please lift up in your thoughts and prayers our church family's mission and ministry, as the Holy Spirit adds to our numbers.

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, June 12, 2017

Action Items

<u>Motion from Personnel</u> – The Session approved Rev. Davis' revised evaluation form for his 2017 Annual Review.

Motion from Youth Christian Education

- Session approved holding a confirmation class this fall in the September/October timeframe.
- Session approved an updated Discipline Policy for use for all children's events and activities. Copies will be posted in classrooms, and given to each parent to read and sign. The new policy will be included in the church policy manual.

<u>Special Report</u> – Session received a package of information assembled by Vickie Faircloth providing additional information on both ECO and EPC denominations. Each denomination requires a vote by the congregation to determine which denomination it wants to join. Following review of the materials, the Session decided to meet in a called meeting on Tuesday, June 13, 2017 at 7:00 pm to hold further discussion.

Motion to Expand Seating During Worship

All Elders present were given an opportunity to suggest alternatives for resolving crowded conditions during worship services. Immediate and longer term solutions were identified. After discussion, three items were identified as solutions that should be the first to be implemented: designated pews, volunteers to sit in the wings, and volunteers to be the last to be seated prior to start of the worship service. Longer term solutions included building a new sanctuary, moving worship to the new fellowship hall, holding a second service, and opening up the doorways between the sanctuary and the side rooms. A motion was made and approved to rescind the trail period for worship in the new fellowship hall and take immediate action to provide reserved seating for visitors. Members will be informed in the bulletin and newsletter by means of a letter to the congregation and asked to consider sitting in the annexed classrooms to the sides of the sanctuary.

<u>Motion to Pay down the Principle on the Building Loan</u> – Session approved a \$10,000 payment on the loan principle.

<u>Congregational Care</u> - Kent Walton reported that the Congregational Care Committee believes that a larger room is needed for the nursery. It was observed that there is no crib in the current nursery. Moving the K-2 class was proposed as a solution, but no decision was reached. <u>Finance</u> - Sam Stephenson presented a detailed financial report updated through May, 2017. Of significance is the short-fall in general fund giving versus expenses in May and year-to-date.
