From the Pastor's Study...

October is a special month ... plump orange pumpkins, golden autumn colors, crisp cool evenings, the smell of a wood fire, football games and marching bands ... these are the things of fall. So many signs of winter slowly edging toward us; day by day, summer eventually becomes a distant memory. Such is the way the seasons unfold.

October is also the month that ushers in Homecoming Sunday. We all look forward to seeing our extended family and reconnecting through fellowship, worship, prayer, food, song and laughter. We are especially joyful this year, for it is our 90th Anniversary of being the body of Christ in the McGee's community. Let us come together in the days and weeks to come and joyfully remember what God has done in our lives.

October's scripture passage comes from the Paul's letter to the church in Corinth. Paul speaks specifically to accomplishing the ministry of Jesus Christ in the world. A snap-shot from 2 Corinthians frames ministry in terms of: 1. we are called to action - to do something; 2. we are dead to the wages of sin; 3. see all others as children of God - Jesus glasses; 4. we are no longer doomed creatures of sin BUT new creations of Christ; 5. we are God's redeemed people; 6, we are called as ambassadors / ministers / servants of Christ - in proclaiming the good news; and finally 7. we must remember Christ's ministry of reconciling humanity to God ... forgiveness, redemption, and grace. Jesus Christ offers us redemption from a weary and burdensome life for Jesus offers our souls rest and burdens us with the task of following Christ who teaches gentleness and humility! Gentleness and humility of the heart and soul begins with a decision ... do we follow our own wants and desires or do we follow God's plan for our lives.


Anyone interested in crocheting and/or just meeting together for fellowship is welcome to participate at any time.

Highlights of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, September 11, 2017

Action Items

Homecoming – The Homecoming letter submitted by the Fellowship Committee was approved for mailing by Wednesday September 13, 2017. The Session unanimously approved using 100% of collections for payment against the principle of the building loan.

Personnel – On September 20, 2017, the Session will hold the annual performance appraisal for Rev. Davis. Reviews for Brittney Jones and Angie Searcy will be conducted on September 13, 2017.

Secretary Search – Kent Walton reported on the search for a church secretary. Three applications were received. The posting date closes on September 15, 2017. Kent expects to be able to make an offer in near future.

Denomination Information/Letter to Congregation – The Session reviewed a draft of a letter to the congregation regarding EPC and ECO, visits by representatives, and a planned congregational vote to select one as the denomination to which Providence will be dismissed following exit from PCUSA. Session chose to mail the letter and distribute additional information by email and at the church as print copy. October 15, 2017 was set as the date for the congregational vote, the same meeting at which consideration of the terms of call for Rev. Davis is planned.

Committee Updates

Children's Christian Education – LOGOS starts next Sunday, September 17, 2017.

Finance – Sam Stephenson presented a detailed financial report updated through July, 2017. The church continues to experience a short-fall in general fund giving versus expenses. July and year-to-date figures:

YTD	\$177 148 30	\$198 146 81

Monetary giving is approximately the same as last year, but not enough to cover church expenses, including the mortgage. We are a little under the budget in spending YTD. All (100%) of the 2017 homecoming offering can be applied to the mortgage principle if we hold onto the remaining funding from last year's homecoming offering as contingency and for mortgage payments. Sam distributed the quarterly financial report of the Providence Presbyterian Women. The information was reviewed by the Session.

Mission & Outreach – Update on church sponsoring Girl Scout Troop: Committee conversing with Girl Scout representative to get additional information on the particulars of program set up and implementation. Additional information will be forthcoming and conveyed to the Session.

Property – Committee is working with sign vendor to produce signs indicating that church premises are off limits for unauthorized parking or as a turn-around area (tractor trailer trucks entering parking lot for these purposes).

Youth Christian Education – LOGOS curriculum will be separate for boys and girls. The proposed curriculum materials were reviewed and Session voiced no objection to the chosen curriculum. Plan for the BBQ and Presbyterian Women's back sale are on track and ready for September 22, 2017 (11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) Youth trip is scheduled for Busch Gardens on October 7, 2017. Confirmation classes will begin in January of 2018.

Worship – New items in suggestion box were reviewed. The committee is working on how to set up an early service in response to sanctuary overcrowding in the event that it is necessary.

Clerk's Correspondence – Emailed approvals were received from Session for the Presbyterian Women's bake sale and Presbyterian Women's Event (planned for winter). Approvals were confirmed during Session meeting.

Pastor's Report – Rev. Davis will be on vacation September 27 – 28. Additional vacation is planned for: October 22 – 24 and December 26 – 28.
