Highlights of Minutes from July 8, 2019 Stated Session Meeting

Correspondence

- The Rev. Dr. William Enns of EPC who assists the denomination with Transitional Pastor placements will teleconference with the Session on Tuesday, July 16 at 7pm.
- Results of the Congregational vote on the Terms of Dismissal were sent to the Executive Presbyter and the PET of New Hope Presbytery. The settlement was accepted by the Coordinating Body (CB). The CB will meet in August and prepare for the October Presbytery meeting and vote.

Open and Actionable Items

Personnel – A recommendation was made by the committee that copies of the EPC Book of Order be purchased for the Session and offered for sale to the congregation. Rather than purchase, the Session agreed to ask David Nelms, the Webmaster, to place a link to the EPC website where the full Book of Order is available as a PDF document. It can be read or downloaded.

Children's Christian Education – The Session approved by consensus accepting an offer from Susan Rudd to lead the rehearsals for the children's Christmas program. A written report was received from the Sunday School Superintendent, Jeff Wood. Sunday School Teacher Appreciation will be held on August 25, 2019. A request was made to approve establishing a Sunday School class for our 18 – 29 year-old members. Session approved by consensus.

Worship

- Campbell University Choir will sing during worship on October 27, 2019. A Love offering collection was approved.
- Head Usher A new Head Usher is needed. A job description will be prepared and efforts made to solicit a volunteer from the congregation.
- Supply Pastors Progress is being made in identifying supply pastors for the coming months.

Committee Updates

Congregational Care – Carolyn Johnson shared that she and Reverend Davis served communion to 11 individuals at Classic Care, including Mr. Brack Johnson, and to Ms. Marilyn Johnson at Barbour Court on June 19, 2019.

Financial – Copies of the June 2019 financial report were reviewed. An \$8,000 CD at Edward Jones matured and was added to the Money Market Fund. A motion was unanimously approved to designate the funds to the "Development Fund" for the purposing of paying the settlement with New Hope Presbytery. The General Fund outlook improved in June as the result of increased giving and donations from both the Presbyterian Women and Men's Fellowship.

Mission & Outreach – A new Girl Scout Troop (Brownies) will begin meeting in the Lower Fellowship Hall on July 16th They will meet the first and third Tuesdays thereafter. Meeting time will be from 5:45 until 7:15 pm.

Property – A solution is needed to solve the bottleneck at the organ. Session approved swapping pews if needed.

Youth Christian Education – Several of the church youth will leave for Camp Caswell on August 5, 2019.

Other Business - A second-hand welcome center was purchased with funds provided by a member of the congregation.

Pastor's Report – Rev. Davis reported on a visit with the Penny's and informed Session that he is preparing for his departure. Rev. Davis asked Cathy Simmons to assume responsibility in his place for the secretary's report of hours worked.

Highlights of Minutes from July 16, 2019 Called Session Meeting

The Session of Providence Presbyterian Church held a called meeting on July 16, 2019 at 7:00pm at the church. The purpose of the meeting was to meet with Reverend Dr. William (Bill) Enns via teleconference and conduct business related to the employment of a Transitional Pastor.

Meeting with Reverend Dr. Bill Enns

Dr. Enns left the PCUSA in 2009 and is a former senior pastor of Hope Church in Raleigh. He currently serves as a leadership coach and organizational consultant to the EPC, and for the past 19 years has mentored ministerial students and pastors. Dr. Enns works with the EPC to assist with appointments of Transitional Pastors.

Dr. Enns shared with Session the objectives of a Transitional pastor. He stated that a transitional pastor is especially desirable for Providence given our dual transitions – to a new denomination and a new pastor. One of the major activities of the transitional pastor will be assisting the church in discerning what God's preferred future is for Providence. The transitional pastor will serve in all ways as the pastor during the transition to EPC and search for a permanent pastor. He stated that Providence should expect a transitional pastor to be with us for 18 to 24 months.

Dr. Enns was asked if Providence should expect to see a decline in giving and attendance. In his experience, he stated, a church normally will see attendance and giving increase as a vision for the future emerges.

He stated that the Session is the search committee for a transitional pastor but that a sub-committee of the Session members can be appointed to conduct the search and present a recommendation to the Session.

Dr. Enns offered his assistance with finding supply pastors in the interim.

Transitional Pastor

- 1. A discussion was held regarding the need to employ a transitional pastor. It was agreed by consensus that a transitional pastor from the EPC should be hired.
- 2. Session agreed that a Transitional Search Committee (TSC), a sub-committee of the Session, should be appointed to review candidates and make a recommendation, including a contract, to hire a candidate. It was agreed that the sub-committee could ask one or two inactive elders to participate. A motion was made and approved to form the ISC sub-committee.
- 3. Transitional Search Committee A motion was made and approved for Donna Stolle, Vickie Faircloth, Scott Martin and Carolyn Johnson to form the sub-committee.

Update: The TSC has been joined by Jeff Wood, inactive Elder of Providence Presbyterian Church.
