From the Pastor's Study...

"Stinky Feet and Salvation Souls"

Once upon a time, there was a group of friends who were trying to make it into the kingdom of heaven. As so often happened, these friends would debate about where they would sit in heaven based on which of them was the "greatest." One day, as they were celebrating the Passover, their Rabbi stood up, took off his coat and proceeded to fill a pitcher with water and set about to washing the men's feet. Now, these were no ordinary feet; these were travelers feet with just a thin strap of leather between them and every dirty, dung laden road they had travelled that week. Stinky gym socks were no match for what was caked on these men's feet! And yet their Rabbi, who clearly shouldn't have been doing the work of the slaves, was washing their feet! As the Rabbi finished, he stood up and dried his hands as the friends looked at each other in wonder and awe, and then he said:

"Do you understand what I have done for you? You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them."

EPC Q&A: Why are we called the "Evangelical Presbyterian Church"?

This is a continuing Q&A article series regarding questions which the congregation may have about the EPC or practices at Providence. If you have a question, feel free to share it with Pastor Nadia at nstropich@hotmail.com

This month's question is "Why are we called the Evangelical Presbyterian Church"? And it's a great question because the founding Teaching and Ruling Elders of the EPC were intentional about how they named the new Presbyterian movement they were creating in 1981. So, let's go word by word and examine why we're the E.P.C.

Evangelical: The word 'evangelical' is from "the Greek word *euangelion*, 'good news,' or 'gospel.' In its most general sense *evangelical* means being characterized by a concern for the essential core of the Christian message, which proclaims the possibility of salvation through the person and work of Jesus Christ." For the founders of the EPC, they wanted the new denominational movement to be marked by an understanding that we hold essential doctrines about the one, holy Triune God, the fall and salvation of humankind and our place and purpose in the world as followers of Jesus Christ. They also wanted to make sure that the denominational movement would not lose sight of Jesus' command to share this good news with the world, as stated in Matthew 28:18-20. Therefore, we are "Evangelical" in that we seek to spread the Good News of salvation while holding to the Essentials of our Faith.¹

<u>Presbyterian:</u> This refers to our Reformed heritage, system of governance and some basic theological underpinnings of our denominational movement. When Martin Luther nailed his 95 Thesis to the doors of Wittenberg Church he didn't know that he would be fanning the embers into a flame that became the Reformation movement in history. That movement created numerous denominations, one being the Presbyterians who followed the teachings of John Calvin. Calvin not only wrote numerous theological works but also outlined a system of government that was adopted by Geneva and the Presbyterian churches in the mid-1500. This form of government allows checks and balances between the "courts" of the church: Session, Presbytery and General Assembly. Sound familiar? The United States government was also set up in a similar fashion to the Presbyterian governance model with checks and balances between the branches of government.

<u>Church:</u> At the end of the day, we're all about being the hands and of Christ. We understand that while God's invisible church consists of all believers, past, present and future, the visible church exists as local congregations who worship and minister together weekly. As the EPC we are a fellowship of congregations united together through our church government (polity), doctrine and love of Jesus Christ!

<u>Fun Fact:</u> You may have noticed that the EPC does not define itself as a "denomination." That's because the EPC understand itself to be a global movement seeking to save the lost for Jesus Christ. We're not just another church on the corner but one whose message and mission extends to the ends of the earth for God's glory alone! You can check out more fun facts about the EPC at www.epc.org

Highlight of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting January 13, 2020

Open and Actionable Items

Finance – Giving was generous in December at \$41,039.19. In addition, a gift of stock in the amount of \$100,000 was received. Year-end expenses exceeded revenues by \$1,123.92. Providence closed the year under budget.

Notable figures in the Year-end Report include:

Checking Account Balance\$66,362.85

By consensus, Session agreed to use the \$21,772.54 balance in the Homecoming fund to pay the mortgage for January, February, and March of 2020.

Long Range Planning/Finance – A motion was approved to apply the proceeds from the sale of the donated stock towards the principal of the loan pending the completion of negotiations by the Refinancing Sub-Committee. The amount of the gift totaled \$102,599.69

Fellowship/Property Sub-committee – Session heard a report on the agreement with Johnston County Board of Elections to use the foyer outside of the Upper Fellowship Hall (UFH) as early-voting location in February, 2020. Dates of use span from February 10 – February 29, 2020, excluding Sundays. The public will have access to the restrooms and water fountains. Barriers will be in place to block access to the Sunday School hallway. Church volunteers will be on hand from 7 am until 8:30 pm. The public will not have access to the UFH Providence will pay Jamone Johnson to come in each evening for any cleaning that is required. Net income from the County will total \$8,000.

Corporate – A motion was approved to call a Meeting of the Corporation on January 26, 2020 immediately following. Worship for the express purpose of electing the following as Officers of Providence Presbyterian Church of McGee's Crossroads, Inc.:

- President Scott Martin.
- Vice President Kevin Creech.
- Treasurer Sam Stephenson, and
- Secretary John Kopanski.

Presbytery Meeting Commissioners – The Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic meets on January 24-25, 2020 at Darlington, SC. A motion was approved to elect RE Vickie Faircloth and RE Eric Faircloth as commissioners.

Items from Omnibus – Property Chair brought forward three items for discussion:

- **Movement of Sanctuary Overflow** from the Lower Fellowship Hall to the Upper Fellowship Hall. This will require a better quality of projector than the one currently in use. The Boy Scouts plan to donate \$1,000 of the \$3,000 needed to purchase the projector.
- **Tree Removal** Session accepted an offer by Atlee Roberts and Kent Walton to remove trees around the Manse.
- **Upper Parking Lot** Permission was granted to the Property chair to seek a sponsor to raise \$1000 to pay for materials to line off the parking spaces in the upper parking lot.

Next Stated Session meeting will be held February 10, 2020 at 7pm.
