

PPC Session, through a joint Long Range Planning/Worship group is drafting how an early service (8:30-9:30am) would be structured at PPC. Our objective is to make worship at PPC a meaningful and comfortable experience for current members and friends, as well as for visitors coming in for the first time looking for a church home. We believe keeping the 11:00am worship intact as our traditional service and having a flexible early service will provide options that may appeal to a cross section of folks. In examining each segment of our existing service, we have decided the liturgical pieces will remain the same for an early service. Recorded music with lyrics projected on the screen may become a part of the early service in the future.

When might an early service be implemented? Whenever Session feels we have a complete plan, one that addresses every detail involved in providing a service with integrity. Some of you may have heard that there was a 16 Sept kick-off date. That was an unpublished "hope for" target date not etched in stone. Our desire is to have a complete plan ready to use at the drop of a hat. Our plan working towards implementation includes a congregational meeting in the Upper Fellowship Hall where we can share the proposed plan and have a Q&A session.

After much consideration, it was agreed that live music is greatly desired for an early service. Music may be integral to the success of an early service. To that end, we are looking for someone within the congregation who might have the skills to be the early service pianist. Someone who would not mind playing unpaid for an asyet-to-be-determined initial number of months. If not committed every Sunday, could multiple people share this service by taking one or two Sundays each a month? Our hope is that if we see growth in attendance (and not just a shift of current attendees between the two services) the growth will represent giving that will afford PPC the ability to then compensate a dedicated pianist for the first service. The pianist is being asked to play the prelude, three hymns, the doxology, during the passing of the peace and then the postlude. The music is found in the "Worship & Rejoice" blue hymnal that we currently use.
