From the Pastor's Study...

June is here once again and we have another opportunity to celebrate Communion Sunday on the 5th, Graduation Sunday on the 12th, Father's Day on the 19th, and warm days filled with all the opportunities that Summer brings with it. There are opportunities for mission this month in terms of our Blood Drive on Friday June 17th, Back Pack Buddies donations, Food Pantry donations, and other opportunities mentioned in the bulletin each week.

In June's scripture passage, 2 Timothy 3:12-17, which states "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work". Studying the Bible is a part of being in relationship with God.

The first lines of the book of proverbs are: *"For learning about wisdom and instruction, for understanding words of insight, for gaining instruction in wise dealing, righteousness, justice, and equity; to teach shrewdness to the simple, knowledge and prudence to the young -- Let the wise also hear and gain in learning, and the discerning acquire skill, to understand a proverb and a figure, the words of the wise and their riddles. The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge."*

Francis Bacon proclaimed in 1597 *"For also knowledge itself is power"* this is a derivation of **Proverbs 24:5** *"A wise man has great power, and a man of knowledge increases strength"*. Studying the word of God increases our strength in God ... where God increases and we diminish ... where we become more Godly. priests and scribes who record the words of God ... scrolls beings read in the temple ... well up in our memories as we dwell in God's Word. In the Old Testament, scripture exists so that the Hebrew people may live in a right relationship with God. It is of the utmost importance that Jews live every moment in accordance with God's law!

I wonder as Christians today ... do we have the same feeling about this? Our own denomination, the PCUSA, has chosen to edit God's Word and interpret many passages of scripture as irrelevant, antiquated, and even claim some passages to be false. This also is nothing new, through the centuries there have been many schisms in the larger Christian church.

Even in the time of Jesus, this was common place so much so that he spoke these words in Matthew 5:17-20 ¹⁷ "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. ¹⁸ For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter,¹ not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore, whoever breaks¹ one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.


I am saddened however, that it has occurred in our own time. Obedience to God's Word is often hard work and yet we called to such a vocation by Jesus our Lord and Savior.
