Members of Providence Presbyterian Church,

Our church has been blessed in many ways over the years. We have also experienced much change and growth. Over the last several decades some of that change included decisions PCUSA has made with which we have not agreed. Previous sessions have communicated our concerns through letters sent to both the Presbytery and PCUSA. The current session felt the direction of PCUSA was contradictory to our deeply held beliefs. Many session members have heard the voices of our congregation and set in motion, through a call and letter, the prescribed process indicating our desire to leave New Hope Presbytery and PCUSA.

The first step in this process was the letter the session sent stating our desire to leave. The second step was the November 10 meeting Reverend Davis and David Nelms had with a committee of four (two teaching elders and two ruling elders) which is termed a PDT (Presbyterian Discernment Team). This meeting was conducted at the New Hope Presbytery Offices. The third step in the process was the December 5 meeting at PPC which included session and incoming elders-elect and the PDT. The meeting went well; the session feels the PDT understands the unity of this move within our session and congregation.

The next step in this process requires the PDT to meet with the congregation, to discuss our desire to leave and answer any questions or concerns. This meeting of the congregation with the PDT has been scheduled for **Sunday January 29, 2017** at 3pm in our Upper Fellowship Hall.

The congregation is invited (encouraged) to attend this meeting so that the PDT can hear their perspective regarding separation from PCUSA, and ask any questions they may have regarding the process.

Future steps depend on the outcome of this meeting between the congregation and the PDT. Please know that this is not the time for a vote from the congregation overseen by the presbytery.

Please keep our church as well as New Hope Presbytery and PCUSA in your prayers.
