


PRAYER SHAWL CIRCLE JUNE, JULY AND **AUGUST 2017**

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, May 15, 2017

Action Items

- Motions from Children's Christian Education
 - Session approved a change to the design of the t-shirts for VBS. Change will allow adult shirts to be used for multiples years.
 - Session approved cancelling Children's Worship for Sunday, May 28 due to the Memorial Day weekend.
- Motion from Long Range Planning Approved moving worship services to the new fellowship hall for a four (4) month trial period from September 3 through December 31, 2017 to resolve the crowded conditions on many Sundays. Johnny Wood responded that it has become difficult to find seats for late arrivals. He reported that on several Sundays we have had visitors arrive in the Narthex and leave because of the crowded conditions. The many details related to the trial will be addressed by the Long Range Planning, Fellowship, Worship, and Property committees in the months leading up to September.

Fellowship

- Approved revisions to the guidelines on use of the new fellowship hall. The changes largely reflect a need to clarify usage by individuals or group activities not related to the church.
- The Session agreed to invite David Dupree to be speaker for Homecoming.
- <u>Motion from Worship</u> Approved drafts of an updated version of the church trifold flyer and of a new visitor card to be placed in the pockets on the back of the pews.

• Gracious Dismissal

- ECO Application Session agreed to a thorough review and comparison of ECO and EPC polity and essential tenets from the perspective of Providence. Vickie Faircloth will lead the effort and seek assistance from elders of the church and the individuals who formerly served on the subcommittee to identify alternatives to PCUSA.
- Mary Ann Booth informed the Session of progress by the SCC. During the first week of June, the committee will mail the information requested by New Hope Presbytery.
- <u>Suggestion Box</u> A process for reviewing and responding to suggestions was defined. Session will review the comments at each stated meeting and assign them to a committee for a response and appropriate action as needed.
- <u>Personnel</u> The elders of the Session have agreed to assume the duties of the Personnel committee. Stephanie Bagley will continue as committee chair. The committee worked on updates to Rev. Davis' mid-year review.

Committee Updates

<u>Youth Christian Education</u> – Rev. Davis reported that plans for a 2017 confirmation class have begun. <u>Finance</u> – Sam Stephenson presented a detailed financial report updated through April, 2017. General Fund receipts for April were \$27,225.96. Expenses for April were \$26,178.42. A \$10,000 donation from Presbyterian Women was used to pay down the principle of the building loan. <u>Congregational Care</u> – Kent Walton announced that Rick and Margie Taylor would be recognized at the start of the worship service on May 21, 2017 as the recipients of this year's Outstanding Senior Adults award.

Property

- Johnny Wood reported that Boy Scout Rob Nooney from Troop 210 has volunteered to create permanent reflective markers for the entrance to the upper parking lot as a service project.
- Church Insurance has been updated to reflect the addition of the cooking shelter.

Pastor's Report

- The membership of the church grew by two on April 23, 2017 with the addition of new members, Wendy Flesch and Patricia Poole.
- Rev Davis will take a personal day on June 6 and be on vacation June 25 July 7. Rev. Tim Bunn will preach on June 25, and Rev. George Dudley fill-in on July 2

<u>New Business</u> – Session approved two (2) requests from the Fitness Fellowship: 1) to allow them to invite members of area churches to participate, and 2) the addition of one or more benches around the new parking lot. The Session will ask the Boy Scouts of Troop 210 if they would take on the benches as a service project.

Gracious Dismissal Update

The Special Committee of the Congregation (SCC) has begun its work as your representatives to negotiate the terms of dismissal from the Presbytery of New Hope. The committee, Kristy Stephenson, Jeff Wood, Steve Nordan and Mary Ann Booth, is compiling the information requested by the Presbytery in preparation for the start of negotiations in late summer. The members of the SCC pledge that we will conduct our work ethically, morally, legally, and in the best interest of the congregation. The SCC asks for your prayers.

Next steps in the process:

- 1. The SCC will complete the collection of information to mail on or around June 1, 2017 to Ed McLeod, chair of the Presbytery Discernment Team from New Hope Presbytery.
- 2. July 25, 2017 New Hope Presbytery meets; a Presbytery Engagement Team (PET) will be appointed to negotiate the terms for dismissal with the SCC from Providence.
- 3. The SCC will meet together as it deems necessary in advance of and during the negotiations with the New Hope PET. Updates will be provided to you as we proceed.
- 4. Once there is agreement between the PET and SCC on the terms of dismissal, the congregation of Providence will be called together to vote of the terms. Upon approval by the congregation, the Presbytery will vote on the terms.

Timeline for Dismissal:

- The earliest possible date on which the Presbytery could vote to dismiss Providence to a new denomination is October 28, 2017, just three months after the commissioning of the PET by the Presbytery.
- The next date on which Providence could be dismissed is in February of 2018.
