From the Pastor's Study...

This month we celebrate Mother's Day, our graduates, Memorial Day, and our annual Fish Fry! May is a month which comes on the heels of celebrating Easter and it is a time of renewal — remembering our Lord Jesus Christ redeemed us from our sins and freed us to live lives filled with love and hope. We also celebrate National Day of Prayer so let us be in prayer for God's will to be done in our lives, in our homes, in our community, and in the world.

May's scripture of the month is John 14, we hear an account from the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ. Jesus is speaking of heaven and his relationship with God Almighty. In the first two verses, Jesus speaks of God the Father: verse 1 - "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me." And then in verse 2 -Jesus says "I go to prepare a place for you ... in (his) Father's house". Thomas asks the poignant question: "How can we know the way?" and then Jesus answers Thomas, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. ⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." 8 Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." 9 Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? 


PRAYER SHAWL CIRCLE MAY, JUNE, JULY AND AUGUST 2017

Mission & Outreach Committee

The Mission & Outreach Committee is exploring the possibility of participating in the North Carolina Department of Transportation's ("NCDOT") Adopt A Highway program ("AAH"). Towards this end, the committee contacted the NCDOT representative and obtain program information related to: Overview of AAH, program application process, and a map of sections of highway available for adoption. Here is a brief overview of the program:

- There are no fees associated with participating in the program. All materials (i.e. bags, gloves, safety items) needed to implement the program are provided by the NCDOT.
- There is a four (4) year agreement with the NCDOT which includes conducting roadside cleanups a minimum of four (4) times per year (more if needed).
- Length of the roadside cleanup is two (2) miles (cleanup is for both sides of the roadway).
- Minimum age requirement is twelve (12) years of age (with parental consent).
- The section of highway that is available and is within close proximity to the church is Old Fairground Road. A two (2) mile stretch would begin at the intersection of Hwy 210 and Old Fairground Road and conclude at Amber Lane (entrance street into the Olde Lake subdivision) heading towards Mt. Pleasant Road.
- There would be signs installed at the beginning and end of the cleanup route designating that Providence adopted the section of highway.

Of course, we would need dedicated members of the congregation and perhaps affiliated church groups to make this venture successful. It is estimated that fifteen (15) to twenty (20) participants would be needed to conduct the effort efficiently. If there are enough people interested in participating in the program, the committee would begin the application process with the NCDOT. Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting, April 13, 2017

Action Items

- <u>Motion from Children's Christian Education</u> Session approved the suspension of Children's Worship during the month of July
- <u>Motion from Youth Christian Education</u> Eric Faircloth was approved to rotate as Sunday School teacher for the church youth.
- Motion from Congregational Care The usher at the back of the Sanctuary will lock all doors to the church with the exception of the front door to the Sanctuary by 11:10 AM on Sunday during Worship. This action is an effort to ensure the security of members and church property during worship.
- <u>Gracious Dismissal</u> A list titled "Requests for Information and Documents from Providence Presbyterian Church" was received from the Presbytery Discernment Team. Following review, Sam Stephenson, Finance Chair, stated that he will be able to provide the financial information requested. A date of June 1, 2017 was agreed to as a target for having all information ready for handoff to the Presbytery Discernment Team.

Committee Updates

Youth Christian Education – The church youth have been accepted to participate in a mission project with TEAMeffort this summer at Virginia Beach. The project will involve performing minor home repairs and ramp building.

Fellowship – The sign-up sheet for flowers will be moved to one of the bulletin boards just inside the door connecting the new wing of the church to the old building.

Finance – Sam Stephenson presented a detailed financial report updated through March, 2017. General Fund revenues for March were \$20,562.78. Expenses for March were \$29,927.84.

Mission & Outreach – John Kopanski reported that donations to the Food Pantry and Backpack Buddies have been moved from the manse to the caged storage area of the new fellowship hall. **Property** –Installation of the new audio system for the sanctuary was completed.

Natalie Nordan and Todd Clifton met with the committee regarding installation of backsplash in the new kitchen. Mr. Clifton will donate his services. Total cost will be \$550 – 600. The cost will be covered by funds from the DeEtta Wood Memorial fund.

Worship – Donna Stolle reported that the committee is working on a new visitor card.

Pastor's Report - Rev. Davis reported as follows:

- Wendy Flesh and Patricia Pool will join the congregation as new members during the worship service on Sunday, April 23, 2017.
- Kim Callis, church secretary, will be out on vacation the week of May 1 5.
- Reverend Davis will be at Union Theological Seminary for Sprunt Lectures May 8 10.

- <u>Suggestion Box</u> David Nelms completed the addition of a link on the church website for an electronic suggestion box for use by the congregation. All members of the Session will have access to view suggestions.
- <u>Entrance Markers</u> Johnny Wood reported that the Property committee is currently reviewing options for permanent markers at the entrance to the upper parking lot.
