From the Pastor's Study...

Last month God's blessings truly overflowed here at Providence and rendered awesome testimony to our Lord God's presence in our church and community. This year's Vacation Bible School was an awesome display of God's grace, caring Christians, great food, fun, sun and a little rain, crafts, and proclamation of the love of Jesus Christ in our lives. We also thank our in house guest preachers Kent Walton and Joe Martinelli, who offered an inspiring messages. A deep felt "thank you and well done" goes out to all who participated in this month's missions and ministries.

The scripture passage for August comes from Matthew 18:1-7, where Matthew chronicles the words of Jesus, "Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. 5 Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." In response to the disciples' question: Who will be the greatest in the kingdom of heaven amongst them? Jesus speaks of three actions and one condition: 1. change, 2. humility, 3. being welcoming, 4. and not being the cause for others to spiritually stumble. Change is so often the hardest thing we have to do, for old habits die hard. True spiritual change is transformation - becoming a new creature centered on God and God's plan for our lives and thereby allowing the old self to die. Humility is the condition of being willing to step out of a world centered around ourselves. True humility is the condition of being willing to step out of a world centered around ourselves and allow God to be the main focus of our lives. The act of welcoming someone is a facet of hospitality, following Christ's example is a mission of hospitality to declare God's redeeming love. It is a mission of hospitality because Christ meets each and every one of us where we are in life.

While all donations are appreciated, the most needed items are given below.



PROVIDENCE PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

Providence Presbyterian Church is approximately 200 members strong. Women are active in every aspect of life and service at Providence Church.

The Providence chapter of Presbyterian Women (PPW) sponsors and coordinates many opportunities for fellowship and service together. Every woman attending Providence is considered a welcome member of the chapter. The PPW calendar year runs from September to August; officers commit to serve one-year terms. PPW activities currently include the following:

- Bible Study -- Is conducted on the third Tuesday of each month from September to May during our Circle Meetings. Day Circle is held at 10:00am; Night Circle at 7:00pm. Both Circle meetings are conducted in the Upper Fellowship Hall.
- Prayer Shawl Circle -- Takes place on the fourth Tuesday of each month. We meet at 10:00am in the Lower Fellowship Hall. We take a break in June, July and August. (Any other exceptions to the schedule are posted in the bulletin and the weekly email. The PPW schedule is also posted on the PPW bulletin board in the hallway leading to the Upper Fellowship Hall.) Together we enjoy a time of fellowship while we crochet "lapghans" for distribution to folks who are dealing with illness or injury.
- Advent Decorating -- Is coordinated by the PPW and takes place on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. We enjoy a small brunch together afterwards.
- Poinsettia Purchases -- Take place each November. The plants are purchased by members of the congregation through the agriculture program at West Johnston High School. They are left on display in the church through the Advent Season. PPW coordinates the purchase, display and disposition of the poinsettias.
- Annual Christmas Gift Bags -- Are assembled by the PPW and given during the holiday season to folks in the church who are infirmed.
- Chicken Pastry & Silent Auction Fundraiser -- Is a very successful annual event at Providence, coordinated by the PPW. As are all annual fundraisers, this event is supported by the whole congregation.
- Bake Sales -- Are coordinated and executed by PPW at the Chicken Pastry & Silent Auction, the Men's annual Fish Fry and the Youth's annual BBQ.
- Lifetime Service Honor -- Is typically bestowed annually on a member who has demonstrated a consistent life of service through the ministries at Providence. An ad hoc committee of PPW members conducts the process from search to final presentation.

In addition to opportunities outlined above, women at Providence Church also enjoy socializing together throughout the year. The women of the church are very active in serving in the wide variety of ministries available at Providence. There is a place for everyone to plug in and become an integral part of the life of service at Providence Presbyterian Church. Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting July 9, 2018

Open and Actionable Items

Children's Christian Education – A motion was approved to accept three documents into the Providence Church Policy and Procedures manual: (1) Children's Christian Policy and Procedures Handbook; (2) Sunday School Teacher Handbook; and (3) Parent's Handbook **Property** – Session approved a motion to limit meetings to 90 minutes. Unfinished business will carry over to the next meeting.

Financial Statistics – Session discussed the removal of some financial statistics from the back of the Sunday bulletin. The information will remain available in the monthly financial reports available to members in the Sanctuary foyer. An announcement regarding the change will be provided to the congregation at a Town Hall meeting on July 22, 2018. A motion was approved to allow the Special Committee of the Congregation (SCC) access to the designated fund titled "Development Fund."

LRP/Worship – Plan for a second service were discussed. The Session agreed that the Elder of the Month would serve at both services. The Elder preparing communion will set up for both services.

Committee Updates

Adult Christian Education – It was announced that the Presbyterian Women have chosen the third Friday in March as the date for the Chicken Pastry going forward.

Fellowship – Rev. Davis reported that he spoke with Rev. Westlund, pastor of Englewood Presbyterian Church (EPC) in Rocky Mount at the EPC Annual Gathering. Rev. Westlund confirmed his plan to be with us to deliver the Homecoming sermon in October.

Finance – The June 2018 financial report was reviewed, and a copy of the Men's Fellowship quarterly report was distributed. Giving to general funds was again insufficient to meet expenses. Giving for the year is down verses 2017.

Committee chairs were reminded that they should be preparing their proposals for the 2019 budget.

Mission & Outreach – The committee is planning a rework of the flyer previously used in community outreach. The congregation will be asked to distribute the flyers in their neighborhoods.

Property – An announcement will be placed in the bulletin to inform the congregation about the covers placed over some light switches. This was necessary to ensure proper functioning of the automated lighting system.

Youth Christian Education – A report on the youth mission trip to Tennessee was received and a "thank you" note was read from the staff of Team Effort expressing their appreciation for the hard work and commitment of the Providence team. The youth will speak to the congregation about their experience at the start of the worship service on Sunday. On Monday, July 16, the youth will leave for a retreat at Fort Caswell.


