From the Pastor's Study...

Our church family also blesses and sends another Youth mission team to minister to God's people in need by offering their hands, hearts, elbow grease, smiles, laughter, grace filled conversation, and Christian witness. Please pray for their safe journey and a truly life changing mission opportunity for our entire mission team.

This month's scripture passage Ephesians 4:11-16, where the Apostle Paul writes a letter to the church at Ephesus. In this passage, Paul reminds us that we all have our own unique God given gifts for mission and ministry and that only together can we truly be the body of Christ – the Church as the extension of the Kingdom of God here on earth. We are reminded that through: working together - building each other up – discipling one another ... can we become mature as Christians. It seems as if every day we hear of one more way God, and God's people, have been excluded, ridiculed, or even persecuted for the morals and integrity that we are held to by living a life centered on Christ and living a repentant life ... going... discipling ... baptizing ... and teaching each other the abundant gracious love of God Almighty.

¹¹The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. 14 We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. ¹⁵ But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting on May 16, 2018

Correspondence

The clerk informed the Session of the receipt of a letter from the New Hope Presbytery Committee on Ministry citing acceptance of the change to terms of call of the Pastor for 2018.

Open and Actionable Items

Presbyterian Women – Request to hold a bake Sale during Youth Barbeque – Youth leader Kevin Creech stated that it would be fine with them for the women to hold a bake sale during the youth fundraiser.

Donations – The Session is glad to receive gifted items but retains the right to approve acceptance of such gifts.

Children's Worship – It was confirmed that the plan for this year is to take a break in July. Several elders expressed interest in preparing a learning opportunity for the children on one or more of the Sunday's in July.

Worship – A draft plan for an early service was reviewed. Several items remain to be resolved. The potential for an early service to help grow the church was discussed. The goal is to have everything in place to begin holding an early service in September.

Congregational Care – A motion to name Carolyn Stevenson as outstanding older adult from Providence was unanimously approved.

Gracious Dismissal – The Session responded to a request from the Special Committee of the Congregation to provide additional financial information to the Presbytery Engagement Team (PET). The ability of Providence to pay New Hope Presbytery a settlement on separation from PCUSA depends in part on our financial status. Revisions to the 2018 budget to reflect the current level of giving were reviewed.

Committee Updates

Fellowship – The Homecoming committee will meet on May 29, 2018. An announcement will be placed in the bulletin to invite those interested in participating in the planning.

Finance – The treasurer reported that giving picked up in April, in part due to a gift of \$7,054 from the Presbyterian Women to pay the monthly mortgage.

It was decided to contact the parents of the participants to determine if they had an objection to the girls traveling without a male presence. On June 9, 2018, the youth will travel to Smithfield, NC to the Miracle League for games. The youth will present a check to the Miracle League representing donations received at the Souper Bowl this year.

Worship – The committee met and had two additional members in attendance. They both had responded to an invitation to the congregation to participate if interested in the committee.
