From the Pastor's Study...

March is upon us once again and we celebrate the Lenten season which leads us into Easter the first day and the Sunday in April this year. March ushers in March Madness as well. This month, let us be true A.C.C. fans (Always Christ Centered) and let's get excited about what God has in store for the future of Providence Presbyterian Church! Go Team!

The Lenten narrative focuses on the forty days prior to the crucifixion. On Easter morning this year, we will celebrate by partaking in communion in the fashion of Jesus and his twelve disciples. Jesus proclaim "This is my body, which is given for you ... This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood ... Do this in remembrance of me." These are familiar phrases when we celebrate Communion together in church and these are also words which were spoken during the last Passover Meal that Jesus shared with the disciples. The seder meal served during Passover finds it's root firmly embedded in this Jewish tradition that recounts an almighty God who acts mightily on behalf of the Israelites during the Exodus narrative. The season of Lent, like a seder meal, bids us to recount another mighty act of our gracious God on behalf of all people – the Passion of Jesus as Christ and Messiah.

It is tradition during Lent to give up something from our life of plenty as a stark reminder of the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and that our gracious God and creator gave His only Son to redeem a sinful world. Let us all celebrate the Lent season in meditation, prayer, and reflection on what our lives would be like had God chosen not to invest anymore in humanity.

This month is a wonderful time in the life of our church - to have God bless us in so many new ways is a blessing. We have opportunities to meet new folks ... meet the needs of our community... we have new ways to celebrate our joy in this life... another softball team opportunity and each day is a new day to celebrate the gift of life from our Lord. I believe we have the opportunity to get closer to God's plan for us as the church - body of Christ – and to seek how God's plan inspires and changes us.

March Scripture Passage

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God -- 9 not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰ For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Highlights from Minutes of Stated Session Meeting on February 12, 2018

Correspondence

- Email from Rev. McLeod, chair of the New Hope PET, requesting the names of the negotiating team for Providence and reflection documents from the Session and Rev. Davis.
- Email from New Hope Presbytery with copies of resolutions and overtures that will come before the February 24, 2018 Presbytery meeting for vote.
- Annual reports were submitted to PCUSA and the Presbytery of New Hope.

Open and Actionable Items

Children's Christian Education – A motion was approved to accept "Shipwrecked" by GROUP as the 2018 Vacation Bible School program. The theme of the program is "Jesus Saves."

Gracious Dismissal – Rev. Davis reported that he had not completed the reflection paper required by the Presbytery Engagement Team that he had begun writing. He apologized for the delay.

Personnel – The Session will receive copies of Rev. Davis' objectives for his mid-term performance evaluation. All Session members were asked to provide feedback to the Chair. Rev. Davis said that he would provide his goals apart from those associated with his performance evaluation.

Committee Updates

Adult Christian Education – It was reported that 63 attended the Women's Day event on February, 10, 2018. Phyllis Elvington gave and inspiring presentation that was well received. The men of the church will hold an organization meeting on Tuesday, February 13, 2018. They will elect officers and discuss activities for the coming year.

Children's Christian Education – Jennifer Crocker is now the Nursery Director. We have a mix of infants and toddlers most Sunday's and is crowded. The committee will consider options for a larger space or for separating toddlers from infants.

Congregational Care – The committee has been unable to visit regularly due to sickness, but hopes to return to its usual schedule soon. Information was shared about the passing of Miriam Lambert's mother.

Fellowship – The sign-up list for fellowship time each Sunday will be moved to the bulletin boards between the Sanctuary and the Sunday School classrooms. The committee decided against renting classrooms for the time being. A committee member will be present for all fellowship hall rentals.

Finance – A motion was approved grant a request from our housekeeping staff to reduce their pay by the amount of the tithe that they give to the church out of their salaries. A bank statement mix-up requires a rework of the December and January financial reports. New reports will be forthcoming. The one report he was able to provide the Session was the report of January expenses. Expenses for January totaled \$26,746.77

Personnel – A new committee was formed. The pastor's mid-year evaluation will be in April.

Property – A number of repairs and maintenance items was reported. A motion was approved to relocate the mailboxes from behind the Sanctuary to the choir rehearsal room. The Boy Scouts will be asked to create and erect new reflector poles at the lower parking lots.

Youth Christian Education – Information was shared regarding a mission trip, retreat, and outings for the Youth during the spring and summer. Youth Sunday is scheduled for April 29, 2018
