

HURRICANE RELIEF

Hurricane Florence has come and gone and left devastation in her path. There are families and businesses that will be suffering varying degrees of hardship for days and months to come. The Session at Providence Presbyterian Church (PPC) has approved the following ways you can consider being a part of the post-storm relief. The relief campaign at PPC will be administered by the Mission & Outreach Committee and will run through the month of October.

Samaritan's Purse -- Is a well-oiled machine that provides relief both domestically and internationally. They have smart response plans conducted efficiently, with Christian love and compassion.

- If you would like to donate money to this organization you can write a check to Providence Presbyterian Church; put "Samaritan's Purse Hurricane Relief" on the memo line. Deposit the check in the collection plate on any Sunday, now through October 28, 2018. One check will be written from PPC and sent to Samaritan's Purse after October 28.
- In recognition of the various giving opportunities in place this fall at PPC, we will be suspending the M&O quarterly campaign to collect funds for Samaritan's Purse International Relief (SPIR). Our kick-off quarter, July/August/September, which included donations from the children attending VBS, was extremely successful and resulted in \$700.00 worth of donations. These donations are in support of a gift chicken program to help farm families in other countries help themselves, by having eggs to sell and eat. Our check will be sent to SPIR the first week in October. We will reconvene this campaign in January 2019.

NC Food Bank -- Collections received at PPC will be delivered to the location in Raleigh after Oct 28.

Highlights of Minutes from September 10, 2018 Stated Session Meeting

Open and Actionable Items

Children's Christian Education – Session approved a motion to approve LOGOS curricula for Middle School and High School youth and the list of 2018-19 Sunday School teachers

Nominating Committee – The need to organize an Elder nominating committee was discussed. Four elders are scheduled to roll off: Sam Stephenson, Johnny Wood, Kent Walton, and Atlee Roberts. Johnny Wood volunteered to serve as chair of the committee and set the nomination process in motion. The Congregational Vote of Elders will be held November 18, 2018. Installation will be January 6, 2019. In the event of bad weather, the installation will be held January 13, 2019.

Budget – Sam Stephenson, Finance Chair, stated that he will announce a date for the budget meeting to be held in advance of the next Session meeting. The Session will finalize and vote on the budget at the October 8, 2018 Stated Session meeting. Harvest Sunday will be November 4, 2018, at which time the 2019 budget will be shared with the congregation.

Clerk Report – Updates were made to the church register. Kevin and Mary Powell joined the church on August 26, 2018 and were added as new members. Active membership now stands at 196.
