Men's Fellowship Group Assistance


Small chores & household assistance is available by the Men's Fellowship Group. To schedule, contact Pastor Jim Davis or the Secretary with your needs.







The Session has called a congregational meeting for Sunday, July 14th, immediately following the worship service to vote on the Agreement of Dissolution of the Pastoral Relationship between Reverend Jim Davis and Providence Presbyterian Church. All active members are encouraged to be present.



A Congregational Meeting was held on the 23rd of June to consider a motion to approve the Terms of Dismissal from New Hope Presbytery and the PC(USA). The motion was approved by 95% of the active members present. New Hope Presbytery will hold a vote on the dismissal terms on October 26th at First Presbyterian Church in Smithfield. If the terms are approved by a majority vote, Providence will be dismissed to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church.



There will Not be a Senior Citizens Luncheon in July.




Change the World

Highlights of Minutes from June 10, 2019 Stated Session Meeting

Visitor

Kathryn Wester, Girl Scouts representative, was present. The Girl Scouts are seeking to form a new Brownie troop (ages $K - 3^{rd}$ grade) in our area and would like to use our lower fellowship hall for meetings on two Tuesday evenings a month. The Girl Scouts want to be an active part of our church and participate where they can help. Meetings would run from 5:45 pm until 7:15 pm. Session approved a motion to permit use of the lower fellowship hall by the Girl Scouts.

Correspondence

Clerk of Session reported on communications.

- Letters were mailed to active members on May 15, 2019 informing them of plan to hold a Congregational Meeting on June 23, 2019 to vote on the Terms of Dismissal from New Hope Presbytery.
- Letters were mailed to active members on June 3, 2019. Included were a letter from the Session and Rev. Davis announcing the dissolution of his pastoral relationship with Providence effective August 5, 2019 and a copy of the Agreement of Dissolution of Pastoral Relationship.
- Conversations were held with representatives of both New Hope Presbytery and the Mid-Atlantic Presbytery of EPC regarding the possible employment of a temporary EPC pastor during the interim between August 4, 2019, Reverend Davis' last day, and the dismissal of Providence from PCUSA in late October. Assuming that the Congregational Vote on June 23, 2019 is in favor of the Terms of Dismissal, both presbyteries have stated their willingness to work with Providence to allow an EPC temporary pastor during that interim and supply PCUSA pastors to moderate Session meetings until Providence is dismissed.

Open and Actionable Items

Welcome Center – An update was received update from the volunteers working on a welcome. No donations have been sought or offered to date to pay for a desk. A solution for mounting the flat screen TV needs resolving. The committee will continue working to identify options for a desk.

Worship – As is usual in July, there will be no Children's Church. At present there are no plans to offer elder-led "Moment with Children" as has been offered in previous years.

Homecoming – An invitation will be posted in the bulletin, announcing an organizing meeting on June 18, 2019 inviting members of the congregation to participate.

Session Call List Updates – The Session reviewed the call list and made updates in preparation for making calls to active members to encourage them to attend the Congregational Meeting on June 23, 2019 **Cooking Classes** – A motion was approved to allow cooking classes to be held in the church kitchen, assuming that there are members interested in teaching classes and members who want to receive lessons.

Financial – The May 2019 financial report was reviewed and approved. The General Fund outlook improved in May. The Presbyterian Women donated funds to pay the mortgage for 2 months. Funds were also transferred to the General Fund from the Money Market Account.
