#### Highlights of Minutes from May 13, 2019 Stated Session Meeting

Report from the Special Committee of the Congregation – Members of the Special Committee of the Congregation –delivered an update on the Gracious Dismissal negotiations. They reported that the negotiations have concluded and provided a draft of the Terms of Dismissal. A motion to approve the terms was unanimously passed.

A motion was made and passed to hold a Town Hall meeting on June 2 or June 9, 2019 to present the Terms of Dismissal to the congregation and answer their questions. A motion was approved to call a congregational meeting for the purpose of voting on the Terms of Dismissal on June 23, 2019. The Session Clerk will send a letter to the active members of the congregation to announce the meeting and prepare announcements for the bulletin and the June newsletter.

#### **Open and Actionable Items**

**Fellowship** – The Men's Fellowship has initiated a new program to provide help to church members with small tasks around their homes.

**Children's Christian Education** – The committee plans to suspend LOGOS for this coming fall. Other options for children and youth will be considered.

### **Committee Updates**

Adult Christian Education – The young adults (18-30 yrs) will meet on Wednesday, May 22, 2019 to make plans for future gatherings. The group will decide the kind of format, content, teachers or speakers they prefer. Safety and Security - There remain concerns and outstanding questions regarding security for big events and during Sunday School. Plans to utilize the walkie-talkies are being discussed. Designated areas for evacuation are needed, especially for parents to know where to find their children in the event of an evacuation.

Children's Christian Education – Planning for VBS has begun, and volunteers are needed.

**Financial** – Copies of the April 2019 financial report were reviewed. Total cash assets including Checking account, Money Market account, ad CD's totaled \$184,167.54 at the end of April. General fund giving in April fell short of expenses for the month.
