The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Christ. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire." And with many other words John exhorted the people and preached the good news to them."- Luke 3:15-16, 18

I grew up watching musicals with my mom and I don't think there isn't a Rogers and Hammerstein musical I haven't seen. So, it's probably because musicals are so engrained in my mind that when I think about joining you all at Providence, I can't help but hum, "Getting to Know You" from *The King and I.* For those who may be unfamiliar with this song, it is sung by Anna, the new English teacher to the children of the King of Siam. (Of which there are about twenty kids ranging from a teenager to a preschooler.) In the chorus they sing, "Getting to know you/Getting to know all about you/Getting to like you/ Getting to hope you like me/Because of all the beautiful and new things I'm learning about you day by day!" As I step into the role of Transitional Pastor at Providence, I feel a bit like Anna—I'm going to be learning all these beautiful and new things about Providence and I hope you feel the same about me.

But as much as I am going to enjoy getting to know you and hope that you will enjoy getting to know Shawn, Madelyn and me, I don't want us to become the focus of our time together. Yes, we want to share our life with you and I hope that you will feel comfortable to share your life with us, but that's not why God ultimately called me to Providence. God called me, just as he calls all of us, to point to his Son, Jesus, here at Providence and in the community.

John the Baptist was one of the greatest "Pointers to Jesus." He wasn't the Christ whom people were waiting expectantly for; he was just the one to point the way. In the same manner, our calling as Christians is not to point to ourselves but to Christ. This is especially important as we walk this time of transition in the life of Providence Presbyterian Church. As we get to know each other's history and God's desired path for the future of Providence, we will find many ways to take part in ministry that points to Jesus and invite others to join us on the adventure of a lifetime.

I look forward to this year of being able to minister with and to each of you at Providence, but I hope that if I do nothing else, it may be said that I was like John the Baptist - preparing the way for God's desired future for Providence and always pointing to Christ!

Congregational Meeting - November 17th

A Congregational Meeting has been called by the Session immediately following worship on Sunday, November 17, 2019. The purpose of the meeting is to elect the Elder Class of 2022. The slate of nominees unanimously recommended by the Officer Nominating Committee include Vickie Faircloth, John Kopanski, and Donna Stolle. Nominations from the floor will be accepted. If you plan to nominate a fellow church member for the Class of 2022, please confer with them in advance of the meeting to confirm that they are willing to serve.

Highlights of the Minutes from a Called Session Meeting, October 3, 2019

A called meeting on the Session was held on October 3, 2019 to review and approve a contract offer to Reverend Nadia Stropich proposed by the Transitional Search Committee. Rev. Carole McCartney served as Moderator.

The committee recommends extending an offer to Reverend Nadia Stropich to serve as Transitional Pastor. for one year with the option to renew the contract.

A motion was made and seconded to approve offering the one-year contract with renewal options to Reverend Stropich. The vote was unanimous in favor of the contract.

The Clerk of the Session will extend the offer, sending a signed PDF contract to Reverend Stropich and Tom Pitman, chair of the Commission of Ministry. The clerk will inform the Executive Presbytery of New Hope Presbytery that an offer is to be extended.

Highlights of the Minutes of the October 14, 2019 Stated Session Meeting

Correspondence

Clerk of Session provided a written report of communications. These included:

- Conversation with Rev. Ted Churn, Executive Presbyter of New Hope Presbytery, to discuss the steps that Providence must complete to have a letter of dismissal issued to EPC Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic. Following a vote by the Presbytery in favor of the terms of dismissal on October 26th, three things are required:
 - Initial payment of \$12,000 must be received by the Presbytery,
 - $\circ~$ All original copies of minutes of the Session must be turned over, and
 - $\circ~$ A quitclaim deed must be executed.
- October 12th Email from Phil Stump of PMA and copied to Rev. Nadia Stropich acknowledging that the 14 Providence elders who received training and were examined are considered to have "passed."

Open and Actionable Items

Finance – Session reviewed copies of and approved the September 2019 financial report. General Fund giving improved in September and spending year-to-date continued to track below budget.

The church will have non-budgeted expenses associated with the dismissal settlement payment to New Hope Presbytery and the employment and relocation of Rev. Stropich. Providence continues to pay severance to Rev. Davis. The Development Fund, a designated fund established to receive donations to help cover the costs of leaving PCUSA, has sufficient funds to cover the \$12,000 payment to New Hope Presbytery for 2019. Homecoming receipts are \$27,184.59 to date.

Budget – Session reviewed the 2020 Budget. A motion was approved to add \$1,500 to the budget for Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic per Member Askings. This is approximately what Providence gave to New Hope Presbytery in prior years. Session was reminded that we must assume that we will be paying Rev. Jim Davis for the full nine months of his separation agreement. This amounts to \$23,400.34 in 2020.

Personnel Committee – A motion was approved for Jeff Wood, inactive elder, to serve as the committee chair through December 2019 and as point of contact for staff until Rev. Stropich arrives.

Children's Christian Education – Session approved a new program for children of the church. The program is called, "PPC Kidz" and would in part replace the LOGOS program. Fun events for both the children and youth are planned through the spring of 2020.

Transitional Pastor Search Committee – Session was informed that Rev. Nadia Stropich has accepted the Session's offer of a contract to serve as our transitional pastor for one year, with an option to extend.

Property – Session approved the installation of a light pole in the median of the upper parking lot next to the crosswalk. The family of Pauline Jones have offered to fund the installation and pay the monthly with funds in the Pauline Jones Memorial Fund. A small memorial plaque will be placed at the base of the light pole.

By-Laws Modification – Acting as Officers of the Corporation, Session Elders voted unanimously to modify the Corporate by-laws and reduce the size of the Session from 12 to 9 members

Committee Updates

Adult Christian Education – David Collier and Kent Walton will serve as class leaders for the College/Career Sunday School class.

Children's Christian Education – Vickie Faircloth reminded Session of the upcoming Family Fall Festival on October 27th.

Youth Christian Education – The Youth BBQ brought in approximately \$7,700.

Old Business – Rich Lambert sent an updated Policy manual to each elder. Rich has undertaken revision and reorganization of the church Policy and Procedures manual. Elders are asked to review their sections for updates or changes.

New Business – A volunteer is sought to update and maintain the scrolling announcements on the monitor in the foyer of the Upper Fellowship Hall.

Next stated session meeting will be held November 11, 2019 at 7pm.
