From the Pastor's Study...

I love Christmas. I love the music, the decorations, even the crowds at the stores. But I especially love the movies: "White Christmas" "A Charlie Brown Christmas" Even "Shrek the Halls" has a special place in my heart and schedule during Christmas time. But the one which I will turn off the phone and put life on hold for is "How the Grinch Stole Christmas"— the cartoon version—not the live action, Jim Carey version—that's sacrilege!

Who doesn't love this movie? "Little CindyLoo Who, who was no more than two" looking up to the Grinch as he stole her Christmas tree? ("Why Santy Clause? Why are you taking our Christmas tree?") The music of Boris Karloff, ("You're a rotter Mr. Grinch…"), as the Grinch shoots pool with the ornaments? The Grinch is by far the best classic "bad-guy" of the Christmas movie genre.

But, as easy as it is to hate the Grinch, he's really you and me. I know, I know, no one wants to be linked with the baddest bad guy of the Christmas season. Who wants to think about themselves as having "a heart three sizes too small"? But really, isn't that who we were before Jesus came into the picture?

The Bible tells us that while Mary and Joseph were in Bethlehem for the census "the time came for the baby to be born" and that baby was Jesus. (Luke 2:6-7) And John said of Jesus that he was God and "In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." (John 1:1-5)

See, the Grinch didn't get the purpose of Christmas until a Light went off in his head. He heard the Whos in Whoville singing and a light rose and came to him and the Grinch realized "Maybe Christmas doesn't come from a store. Maybe Christmas means a little bit more." **That's the story of our redemption. Jesus was born, the Light came into each of our lives and the moment we realized that life was about him EVERYTHING changed for us for the better.** Life, true life, BEGAN! How many of us in our own ways raced down our own snowy, lonely mountains to join the other Christians celebrating Jesus when the light went off in our heads? "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" ends with everyone, including the Grinch, seated at a giant banquet table. "And yes, even he carved the Roast Beast." **Our story, just like the Grinch's ends in a banquet feast. Scripture says, "Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!...The [new Jerusalem] does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp." Highlight of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting November 9, 2020

Providence Presbyterian Church conducted a Stated Session Meeting on November 9, 2020 at 7:00pm in the Choir Rehearsal Room. All seated Elders were present. Ruling Elder and Clerk, Mary Ann Booth, and Moderator, Rev. Nadia Stropich were present.

Omnibus Report

The Omnibus Report of committee minutes, communications, and reports from the Pastor and Clerk was reviewed. Session voted to approve a motion to accept the report.

Financial Report

Sam Stephenson presented a review of the Financial Report for October 2020. Sam's Notes to the report included a reminder that the Harvest Sunday Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 15^{th.} Sam will prepare a presentation of the 2020 performance and the 2021 budget for the meeting. Stewardship Sunday is November 22nd. Sam reported that letters to the Congregation sharing the 2021 budget and including a pledge card will go out on November 16th. Report Highlights include:

- 2020 Homecoming offering to date is \$30,320.00,
- Monthly and Annual receipts exceeded expenses due to rental income from the Johnston County Board of Elections, however, we are still not meeting expenses with regular giving,
- \$14,000 was received from the Johnston County Board of Elections (BoE) for use of the Upper Fellowship Hall during the recent elections. A \$500 security deposit will be returned to the BoE. A total of \$23,500 was added to the General Fund as a result of rental income from BoE during the year, lifting total receipts for the year to greater than the total of expenses. Session was reminded that these funds were unanticipated and will not be repeated next year.

Highlight of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting November 9, 2020

Old Business

Personnel – The following motions were approved:

- Motion to approve Pastor Nadia's vacation plans; November 23 25 and December 28 31,
- Motion to approve allowing Pastor Nadia to carryover to 2021 seven (7) unused vacation days to be used by November 9, 2021,
- Motion to approve backpay in the amount of \$2,700 to Jamone Johnson to make her whole for the months of June through September, and
- Motion to approve Christmas bonuses for the four (4) staff members in the amount of \$50.

Property - Steve Newnam provided a follow-up report on costs to install a security camera system and change outside door locks. Session was asked by Pastor Nadia to consider the information and be prepared with any related motions for the December meeting.

Church Information Form – Pastor Nadia led discussion of Part 3, Question 18 – Major Goals – Consideration of the goals previously listed led to conversation about what Session considers to be our greater goal. Suggestions included expansion and growth of our ministry, reaching more people, growing spiritually, growth in members and baptisms. Session decided more time was needed and set a Called meeting for 7 PM on Monday, November 16, 2020.

New Business

Mission & Outreach - Motion was approved for a Red Cross Blood Drive on January 8, 2021.

Congregational Care – A motion was regretfully approved to accept the resignation of Ruling Elder Carolyn Johnson from Session, effective December 31, 2020.

Worship – A motion was approved for up to \$3,000 for the purchase of additional cable, a wireless mic, a third camera and two speakers to improve the quality of both the live and streamed service. Session agreed that live streaming of the worship service will be a permanent outreach ministry going forward.
