From the Pastor's Study...

Worship in the Time of COVID

"For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline." - 2 Timothy 1:7

There are a lot of things to be frightened of in our world: diseases, war, alien clowns ready to invade at any given moment and overwhelm us with puppy dogs that will suffocate us like Tribbles on the Enterprise...okay, that might just be my personal fear; but you get the point—it can be scary out there! And fear can be healthy—it can keep us from doing unhealthy things for our body, mind and soul. God wants his children to be safe and therefore has put certain "security alarms" in us in order to keep us safe. I'm sure many of you have had the experience of almost touching a hot stove, but the feelings of the heat as you got closer kept you from actually burning yourself. It was the "fear" of being burnt that set off your security alarm that said, "Don't Touch That!"

But there is also a fear that isn't of the Lord; a spirit of fear that keeps us from doing something that the Lord is leading us to do. In the wake of COVID-19, there has been a lot of information and some of it has unfortunately created a spirit of fear among some people. This is not the healthy sense of fear that reminds us to wash our hands, wear our facemasks and social distance, but the spirit of fear that tells us not to reach out when we're feeling alone or depressed by our current situation. An unhealthy spirit of fear can also keep us from moving forward as safety measures allow. It is this spirit of fear that can and desires to harm the church body.

At Providence Presbyterian Church, I want you, the congregation member, to know that Session is doing everything in its power to make sure that as we assess moving back into the church building that we are doing so by discerning the mind of Christ as it relates to the CDC and state guidelines for medium to large gatherings in an enclosed area. We want to make sure that as we do not act with the incorrect spirit of fear that we also do not act without love and self-control. Our love for PPC's congregation is at the heart of our decisions because YOU are at the heart of God's will for his congregation at PPC.

Session may seem to move very fast in reentering the church building to some; to others not fast enough. That's okay. Everyone has their own personal sense of pace at which he or she will want to reengage society. As Christians though, I would ask that we all remember the spirit which we have been given: one which gives grace to us and others as they discern their own level of social interaction; love which calls us to be together when the time is right; and a power to overcome fear which says "No" to God's movement.

Now, be careful out there; you never know when the alien clowns and puppies could land!

Food Pantry Donation Response Extension

The WJHS pantry staff are very appreciative of your efforts. During these times, demand for food assistance remains high. Therefore, the M&O committee has extended the food donation response for the WJHS food pantry.

Thus, during the month of June, the committee will continue to accept food donations in the church parking lot at the cooking pavilion. Donations will be accepted from 9:00 a.m to 12:00 p.m. on the following Saturdays: June 6th, June 13th, June 20th, and June 27th.

Food items most needed are as follows:

Highlights of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting May 11, 2020

Examination of New Members – Session conducted a Zoom facilitated examination of new member candidates. Following their testimonials, and by unanimous approval of Session, Shawn Stropich, Frank Hughes, and Nicole Hughes were welcomed as new members of Providence.

Open and Actionable Items

Blood Drive – Following a presentation by Margie Taylor on behalf of the Red Cross, Session approved a motion to permit the Red Cross to hold the scheduled blood drive on June 5, 2020. Margie explained the protocol in use by Red Cross to protect workers and donors against the COVID-19 virus. Donations will be by appointment only.

Finance Report – The financial report for April was reviewed. First Citizens Bank was paid twice during April. April was the first month for payment under the new mortgage agreement. An automatic draft had not been discontinued as requested resulting in the duplicate payment. The second payment went in full against the principal of the loan. Funds in the amount of \$14,108.62 were from the Homecoming Designated Fund to cover both payments. The amount of \$7,663.92 remains in the Homecoming Fund.

- Session approved a motion to pay the \$1,500 budgeted for the Presbytery in a single payment.

Personnel – Session approved Pastor Nadia's vacation leave for Monday, May 18 through Thursday, May 21 and Sunday, May 24, 2020. Pastoral care will be handled through the Elder Care list. Pastor Nadia will prerecord her sermon for April 24.

Wednesday Night Drive-in Worship – Session approved a motion to add a Wednesday night drive-in worship service every other Wednesday beginning April 13, 2020 and continuing until the church reopens for worship.


