# From the Pastor's Study...

### The Fellowship of Believers

With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation. "Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. The devoted themselves to the apostles; teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Acts 2:40-44

During the COVID-19 stay-at-home orders and lockdowns around the world, church leaders ask themselves, "How do we define church, when the true church is the people and the people are unable to meet?" This is not a new question, as many congregations throughout time and season have not been able to meet. For some, severe weather like hurricanes and tornadoes, or persecution has made weekly face-to-face worship impossible. The question at Providence for the staff and Session has been not only "how do we define church" but also, "how do we continue to be the church body?"

For the early church the criteria of a church body was simply devoting themselves to the apostle's teachings (scripture), teaching and fellowship, breaking bread (sacraments), prayer and sacrificial giving. All those who saw them were in awe because of the signs and wonders done at the apostle's hands. This was the activity and definition of the church.

As strange as it may sound, the COVID-19 crisis has allowed pastors and Sessions a unique opportunity to be creative and flexible in order to minister to their congregations in an effective and safe manner so that the church continues through this pandemic. Like Providence, many EPC churches have started to broadcast worship services via Facebook Live and have seen a significant uptick in people "attending" worship on Sunday morning and throughout the week. These are not just local members attending, but global as well. Before COVID-19 we averaged weekly worship to be about 110 people. Now we average over 217 devices watching our worship service each week and this includes about four devices which are out of state and at least one weekly international device. That means if each device has a couple watching together, we have over 400 people "attending" worship each week....and we know there are families watching together, so the number is probably greater than those who are recorded as watching. These statistics tell us that Providence has a global impact for the kingdom of God; we are part of the church body fulfilling the Great Commission and the EPC's goal to be a "global movement" rather than a denomination. Other Christians are starting to read their Bible as part of the Bible in 90 Days study because of our sermon series as well!

That means that Providence is promoting the study of the apostle's teachings, even while we are unable to meet for Sunday school! Therefore, we are continuing to try new ways to provide better online worship. This will include starting to pre-record our worship services and upload them on Sunday mornings at 11am to help with buffering issues that many in our congregation are having. We want to make sure that we are able to help those in our congregation and world "devote themselves to the apostle's teachings" as we teach through our Sunday worship.

Providence continues to be the church through sacrificial giving as well. The Session, Pastor and staff want to thank the congregation for faithful giving even in the midst of the stock market drops and uncertain personal financial situations. Some families have even said they are considering giving their stimulus checks to the church as an offering above and beyond their personal tithe commitments. This allows Providence the ability to support staff and build life into the ministries and mission to our community here in the McGee's Crossroads area. As Pastor, I couldn't be more proud and humbled by our Mission and Outreach Committee's commitment to our community by continuing the Food Drive through the month of May. Every Saturday between 9-noon you can stop by the outdoor cooking shelter and drop off food for the West Johnson High School Food Pantry. Thank you M&O for giving Providence an opportunity to "have everything in common." And thank you Providence, for taking care of the church so we may take care of others.

Reflecting on the continuation of ministry at Providence during this COVID-19 pandemic and its effect on our world, I wonder if maybe pastors and Sessions should not be asking, "How do we define church, when the true church is the people and the people are unable to meet?" But, "How can we be the church through the Holy Spirit's leading as He unites us through technology and missions during this time of physical separation?" Because, what we are finding at Providence, is that we are still able to carry on the mission of Jesus Christ even if it is through unfamiliar and new avenues. And if we are serving the Lord and one another, then no matter what, we are the church, just as the early church was defined.

### EPC Q&A: What's going on with the PMA & GA?

Okay, I admit this month I wanted to see how many acronyms I could put in the title, but I also wanted to take an opportunity to let you all know about the Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic (PMA) and General Assembly's (GA) actions during the COVID-19 crisis. Like us all, they are continuing to monitor the situation and respond accordingly in a proactive manner in order to serve the churches of the presbytery and denomination. Therefore, in order to stay on top of the newest information at the national and presbytery level, you can go to <u>www.epc.org</u> or <u>www.pmaofepc.org</u>, but if scrolling through press releases isn't your idea of a good time, here are some highlights:

- Prayer Support from the PMA: Each week pastors from the presbytery meet via Zoom for an hour of prayer for our churches and ministries. Pastor Nadia has been participating in these prayer meetings and wants you to know that many churches are feeling like Providence right now and they are praying for us, just as we pray for them.
- The Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic met briefly via Zoom April 25<sup>th</sup> and approved the overture to General Assembly recommending the multiplication of the Mid-Atlantic Presbytery into three presbyteries: The Piedmont, Mountain and Costal. (If approved, PPC will be part of the Costal Presbytery). We also examined a Reformed Pastor Transfer, Rev. Fred Hope for ordination. He passed successfully after a stellar examination and will be serving Rockville EPC. Rev. Hope comes from the Reformed Church of America to the EPC.
- General Assembly will meet this week to vote on moving the General Assembly from June to September and limiting the business of the church to two days, rather than the normal week of continuing education opportunities for Teaching and Ruling Elders. Some presbyteries have asked GA to consider meeting through on-line resources like Zoom or Skype due to the cost of attending GA for two days in Memphis, TN. This is being considered but no decision has been made.
- General Assembly is allowing presbytery and local church Sessions to conduct meetings via Zoom and other on-line resources. This is a practice that PPC Session is currently using and while it is far from perfect, it is allowing us to continue to discern Jesus' plan for PPC and for us to follow it faithfully.
- General Assembly has also authorized the local church to conduct the sacrament of Communion through on-line services. This has been a special blessing for Providence and while your pastor greatly misses worshiping face-to-face around the communion table, it is a blessing to know that we are joined through the Holy Spirit in order to continue to celebrate the sacraments.


# PPC KIDZ

## Highlight of Minutes of Stated Session Meeting April 13, 2020

#### Session held its April Stated Meeting via Zoom video conferencing.

#### **Open and Actionable Items**

**Finance Report** – Session reviewed the financial report for March. It was noted that the Providence congregation was faithful in their giving as evidenced by the income statement. The final payment to Rev. Jim Davis was made in late March.

Items of Note: Designated Funds giving included \$5,100 to the Development Fund to help pay off the obligation to New Hope Presbytery. The amount of \$21,772.54 remains in the Homecoming Fund as none was needed during March to pay the monthly mortgage.

**Review of Loan Refinancing** – Session reviewed the terms for the Note Modification Agreement (Agreement) between Providence and First Citizens Bank. A motion to present the Agreement for vote at a congregational meeting on April 14, 2020 at 7:00 pm was unanimously approved. The meeting will be held by Zoom video conferencing. The terms include 119 monthly payments (approx. ten years) of \$6,160 beginning May 10, 2020 with the balance due at the end of the 119 months. The interest rate is the same 3.6% as the existing loan. The terms reflect the intent of Providence to pay \$102,599. 69 against the principal once the modified note is approved by vote of the congregation. Fees associated with the modification amount to \$900. **Online Giving** – A motion to approve online giving via debit card and credit card was unanimously approved. Payment via e-check will be included at a future date. The option to give online will be available on the church website by clicking on the "GIVE" menu located near the top of the home page.

- Session discussed concerns with the quality of the live worship service on Sunday mornings. An effort will be made to improve transmission.
- **Blood Drive** Session decided to postpone the blood drive that was scheduled to June. A new date has not been determined.
- Local Families in Need An elder was approached about the need for food among families of elementary school children in our community. Chairs of Christian Education and Mission & Outreach will coordinate to consider ways to involve the congregation in providing relief.




