## From the Pastor's Study...

## Blessed to Be a Blessing

Stewardship is something we are all familiar with, even if we haven't been formally trained in it. According to the Oxford Dictionary stewardship is defined as: "the job of supervising or taking care of something, such as an organization or property." Healthy stewardship involves knowing the condition and actively engaging with whatever or whomever we are tasked with supervising and caring. After all, it is one thing to be tasked with a job and another to know what is needed in order to see the job accomplished.

As an active member of the local church, we have been called to serve the spiritual and physical needs of our church, both its members and its material property through stewardship. This is a ministry given to each member which should not be taken lightly for it is our Lord who gave us all this calling.

Where is this calling from Jesus? Here are a couple of examples:

- Luke 16:1-13 The Parable of the Shrewd Servant, especially verses 10-13 in which Jesus says, "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own?"
- Matthew 25: 14-30 The Parable of the Bags of Gold, especially verses 29-30 in which Jesus says, "'For whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them; and throw that worthless servant outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"
- Acts 20:35 Paul to the Ephesians "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

Jesus preached on finances and stewardship more than most people realize. As much as our world likes to tell us that our time, talents and finances are our own, that's not true scripturally.

Then when we celebrate Harvest Sunday, and give our Pledge Cards we can be confident that the Lord will bless our tithes and offerings.

## Session Announcement

Session approved a motion that starting September 27, 2020, we are requesting that everyone who attends worship on Sunday morning to wear a facemask/face shield upon entering the building and throughout the entire worship service until exiting the building. ## Providence Presbyterian Church Minutes of Stated Session Meeting August 10, 2020

All seated Ruling Elders were present. Clerk of Session Mary Ann Booth was excused. RE Kopanski served in her place. Moderator Rev. Nadia Stropich was present.

## **Omnibus Report**

The omnibus report was reviewed. The session voted and the motion was approved.

#### • Actionable Items:

**Mission & Outreach-Motion**: Committee motion presented by the M&O chairperson to get approval for the committee to solicit financial donations from the congregation to support ministry efforts regarding Help Our Teachers ("HOT"). The floor was open for discussion; being none, the session voted and the motion was approved.

## Pastor's Report

- Pastor Nadia distributed an article entitled "Five Types of Church Members Who Will Not Return after the Quarantine". The article surmised that due to the consequences of the Coronavirus churches may anticipate a twenty (20) to thirty (30) percent decline in membership. Pastor Nadia indicated that Providence is experiencing this phenomenon to some degree.
- Pastor Nadia distributed a section of chapter 8 of the Book of Order and discussed 8-3 item D with regards to inactive roll.

## **Financial Report**

Sam Stephenson distributed the financial report for July 2020. He provided an overview of church's financial status which indicated that monthly expenses continue to exceed monthly contributions. He conveyed that for the month of July giving was down; however, this is not uncommon as giving in the summer months tends to generally be lower than other months. Despite the lower contributions for July, generally speaking the report can be viewed optimistically in comparison with previous 2020 financial reports. Upon concluding review of the July financial report, as Finance chairperson, Sam Stephenson presented a motion to approve the July 2020 financial report. The session voted and the motion was approved.

Sam also conveyed the following:

- The church's pool share (McGee's Crossroads community swimming pool) was sold in the amount of four hundred dollars (\$400). Sam indicated that the proceeds were deposited in the general fund.
- Sam indicated that it is nearing time to produce a financial budget for next fiscal year. Committees need to begin thinking about their budgets.

### **Old Business**

As property chairperson, Steve Newnam reintroduced the following motion with regards to the mortgage: Reduce the mortgage payment to minimum monthly amount (approximately \$6,160) beginning in September 2020 and maintain minimum monthly payment until a consistent twelve (12) month (5%) increase in tithing over prior fiscal year is achieved. Thereafter, consideration for increasing the mortgage payment with additional principal could be warranted.

The floor was opened for discussion. The session voted and there was one (1) vote in favor of the motion, seven (7) votes against the motion, and one (1) abstention. As a result, the motion did not pass.

## Worship

Vickie Faircloth, Worship Chairperson presented information with regards to options for Coronavirus mitigation as it relates to the designated Worship space (upper fellowship hall). The information pertained to motions from the committee as follows:

• Committee motion to use the Worship space only for the purposes of Sunday morning Worship precluding all other uses and or activity.

The session voted and there were six (6) votes in favor of the motion and three (3) votes not in favor of the motion. Thus, the motion was approved.

## **Fellowship**

Donna Stolle, Fellowship committee chairperson presented committee motions to cancel the following church events scheduled for 2020 (due to coronavirus):

- Homecoming (with traditional fellowship meal after service)
- Harvest Sunday
- Chicken Pastry Fund Raiser and the silent auction and bake sale which are conducted in conjunction with chicken pastry event.

The session voted and it was with regret that the motion was unanimously approved.

\*On Homecoming Sunday, there will be a Worship service in the upper fellowship hall and invited guest Pastor Bucky Hunsicker will provide the sermon.

# Election of Commissioners for EPC General Assembly annual meeting and Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic called and stated meetings

- **40**<sup>th</sup> **General Assembly Meeting September 17**<sup>th</sup> **and 18**<sup>th</sup> **2020:** David Collier approved as commissioner at previous session meeting. Need one additional commissioner. No Elders volunteered at this meeting to fill the slot.
- Called meeting of Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic August 24<sup>th</sup> 2020: Vickie Faircloth and John Kopanski were approved by session to serve as commissioners for this meeting.
- Stated meeting of Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic September 26<sup>th</sup> 2020: Need two (2) commissioners. No Elders at this meeting volunteered to serve as commissioners.

Being no further business, Pastor Nadia closed the meeting with Prayer.
