From the Pastor's Study...

CHA-Cha-Changes! Turn the World Around!

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. - Matthew 6: 33-34

"All change is first perceived as a loss." Dr. Enns told me. *Yeah, right*. I thought....and then I thought again...wait a second, the night before I got married what did I do? I had my friends and family who had been staying with me transfer themselves to a hotel because I wanted to spend the "my last night alone" by myself. Why? Because I knew I would never be alone in "my" own house and bed again...or at least not for a very long time. What I was experiencing was a change that I perceived—while exciting—as a bit of a loss.

Providence, like the changing of the seasons from winter to spring, is beginning to change again. We are entering into another time of transition in our church history and while it's exciting, there's also a bit of a bittersweet note to it. Yes, we're excited about the formation and work of the Pastoral Nominating Committee, but we may be concerned because we don't know who will apply—what if they try to change who we are? We're also starting a capital campaign to match a donor gift of \$42,000 so that we can pay off the PCUSA. That's exciting but then comes the question, "What do we do now that we don't have to worry about the PCUSA?" Both the PNC and capital campaign are exciting but they are both changes and that can bring a sense of loss because it means what we have known is going to be different.

Jesus understood this concern of ours. After all, he came to turn the world right-side up and restore the order which Satan had ruined with sin. We are comfortable with what we know—not with what could come with change. "All changes are first perceived as loss" but Jesus speaks into that feeling of loss with the words, "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness...do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself." In other words, when we step out on faith and embrace a change, like Peter stepping out of the boat to walk on water, it is easy to get distracted by the waves and become overwhelmed by a sense of loss, but if we focus on God and what he would have us do, we'll find that we get through today quiet well. And the next day. And the next. In fact, we may even find ourselves dancing on the waves with Jesus!

Change does mean that things are going to look different. Change means that there's going to be a sense of loss at first. But change done well—which Session and I are going to do our best with God's help to make sure happens—is going to be good; we don't have to worry—God's got this! How do I know? Because he's done it before and he'll do it again.

April 18th we're going to start a new sermon series called "Managing Transitions" which is based on the book of the same title by William Bridges. We're going to look at the story of Moses and how God led him and the Hebrew people through a season of transition so that they could become the people of God who he needed to take the Promise Land. God is calling Providence into new territory and I'm so excited to be entering this transitional time with you!
