From the Pastor's Study...

"Are We There Yet?"

No doubt anyone who has ever travelled more than ten miles with a fidgety child, youth or adult has heard those dreaded words, "Are we there yet?" It's the mile marker that the trip is beginning to take its toll on the passengers and they are ready to be done with it. But just as "Are we there yet?" is a sign that we're *not* there yet, so is the fact that just because people want the trip done, it doesn't mean that they want to forgo going to the destination at all. See, everyone in the car wants to be wherever the car is going: grandma's house, the Grand Cannon, the beach. The problem is that when someone says, "Are we there yet?" it means they've lost sight of the goal.

Providence has been in a year of transition; from coming into the EPC, changing of pastoral leadership, and COVID, we have experienced a great deal of movement. Many of us may be saying, "Are we there yet?" We feel so close to the end that we can almost taste it, but the wait is getting difficult. The apostle Paul understood what it meant to be so close but so far away to a desired destination. Paul says in Philippians 3:14-16, "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you. Only let us live up to what we have already attained."

Our church is on the verge of some very exciting things. Session is planning that as soon as Presbytery approves our Church Information Form (CIF) we will elect our Pastor Search Committee. This is an important step as we look towards the preferred future which God has planned. Please keep on the lookout as Session will be making copies of the CIF available as well as the requirements for someone to serve on the PSC through email and post mail.

I would ask that we all would be in prayer, asking God if he is calling you to serve on the PNC and praying for those who are called. We, like Paul, are pressing on towards the goal which God has called us heavenward in Jesus Christ. We have come far from where we began, but there is still some distance between where we are and where we want to be. I hope that as we number the miles between "here" and "there" that we take time to enjoy the scenery; get to know our fellow passengers better so that we might serve them better; and seek direction from our Driver and Lord Jesus.

We know the good that comes when Christ drives all our actions and decisions. Pray for the Session and the PSC that we would see where our Lord is driving us, so that our hearts cry isn't "Are we there yet?" but "Look where we get to go!"






PPC Youth Group Souper Bowl of Caring Carryout Lunch

We would like to thank everyone that came out and gave blood and those who helped set up and take down.





Highlights of the Minutes of the January 11, 2021 Stated Session Meeting

Finance: Session reviewed and approved the December 2020 financial report. General Fund giving improved with receipts exceeding expenses.

- Annual dismissal payment in the amount of \$12,000 was submitted to PC (USA) New Hope Presbytery December 2020.
- The church received a donation of fifty (50) shares of Lowe's Stock with a current estimated value of \$8,000. The donation was placed in the church's Money Market Fund.
- Homecoming offering for 2020 totaled \$30,330.00.
- Financial pledges for 2021 totaled \$144,760 comprised of thirty (34) donors.

Personnel Committee: Session approved a committee motion to grant Pastor Nadia Stropich study leave February 1st through February 6th 2021.

Christian Education Committee: Session approved a committee motion to conduct Youth Group "Souper Bowl" fundraiser after worship service February 7, 2021. Financial donations are designated to purchase food items for the West Johnston High School Community Food Pantry.

Mission & Outreach Committee: Session approved a committee motion to solicit financial gifts for Missionary Outreach during the months of February, March, and April 2021. The donations will be designated for Asaph and Lin Din conducting outreach ministries in Pakistan.

Church Information Form: Session finalized the Church Information Form. The information is used to assist with finding a full-time Pastor. The church information ("CIF") form will be submitted to the Presbytery of the Mid-Atlantic later this month. Once the CIF is approved by the Ministerial Committee, the church can establish a Pastor Nominating Committee.

Examination of New Church Member Candidates: Chas and Brittany Davidson were examined by the Session for the purpose of becoming new church members. Chas and Brittany provided their walk of faith testimonials and why they wanted to become members at Providence. A motion was presented to receive Chas and Brittany Davidson into the membership of Providence Presbyterian Church. The motion was unanimously approved by Session. Welcome Chas and Brittany.

Commissioners for the Presbytery Meeting: John Mott and John Pickens were elected by the Session to be Commissioners for the Zoom PMA Presbytery meeting January 30, 2021.

Next Stated Session Meeting is scheduled for February 8, 2021 at 7:00 pm.
