## From the Pastor's Study...

As we continue to learn about how we can be effective Ambassadors for Christ I would like to share with you an inspirational story from <u>The Tale of the Tardy Oxcart</u> by Charles R. Swindoll.

It is my opinion that the best evangelistic center in the greater metropolitan Boston area is not a church. It is a filling station in Arlington. It was owned and operated by a man named Bob who caught the vision early in his life that his vocation and his calling were to be welded together. As time passed, his station became known as the place to go for gas, new tires, or other car service. I have seen a half-dozen cars lined bumper to bumper near two pumps in front of that little station just waiting to be served by that man. He has no banners out, no "Jesus Saves" flags, no signs, no "ichthuses" [fish logos], nothing plastered all over the station or in the windows, no sign, "Bring your car to Bob and take your soul to Jesus." He simply *did his job!* He did it well and people knew he was in partnership with the Lord. He led dozens of people to faith in Jesus Christ.

First I would like you to notice that people knew he was a Christian. The story doesn't tell us how he communicated this fact but word got out. We need not be ashamed of our faith in Christ and we must find appropriate ways to communicate this reality. One simple approach is in how we answer the question on Monday morning, "What did you do this weekend?" Talk about the yard work, the home projects, the family time, the trips, and include that fact that you went to church or you couldn't make it to church. Another idea is that if someone shares a difficult situation in their life how about asking the question, "May I pray for you?" As your friends, neighbors, and co-workers begin to understand that there are spiritual elements to our lives it will open doors to who drives us spiritually and how Christ shapes and directs our lives.

We also learn from this short story to live lives of integrity. We must do our jobs and do them well. We must integrate our beliefs with our actions. People will notice our actions much more than our words and our words will have greater effect if our actions have already displayed the truth contained in those words. How can we share words about grace, mercy, justice, love, and peace unless we are living lives which reflect those words? No matter what we do or where life takes us we can be Christ's Ambassadors everywhere.

May God bless us all as we continue to learn to be Christ's Ambassadors!

#### **2021 Financial Summary**

Following up from a successful 2020 when we refinanced our mortgage with favorable terms, the year 2021 was another successful year for Providence Presbyterian Church. Motivated by an anonymous matching gift, we are able to raise sufficient funds to satisfy the terms of our dismissal settlement with the Presbyterian Church (USA). With the help of another anonymous donation, our General Fund receipts increased by 10% compared to 2020. Total General Fund receipts were \$344,405.67 and our General Fund expenses were \$43,548.71 under budget at \$293,620.64. The pandemic was a major factor in reducing expenses for the year. Including our Designated Fund, our total receipts for the year were \$512,528.17 and total expenses were \$435,681.99. For more information, please contact Sam Stephenson at 919-757-5869.

#### Highlights of January 17, 2022, Session Meeting

#### Worship

Additional chairs have been purchased to replenish those borrowed from the meeting rooms and to replace some of the older chairs in the Upper Fellowship Hall for Worship services.

Due to recent virus reports the Session asked that additional signs be placed in the Church recommending the wearing of masks.

#### **Mission and Outreach**

The Session voted to tithe 10% of the \$45,609.91 of a recent gift to the Church. The Session will decide how best to distribute the remainder of the gift at a later meeting. The Mission and Outreach Committee will use the funds as lead by the Lord and consistent with the Church's mission. Church members contributed 55 toys to the Marine Toys for Tots campaign for Christmas. Thanks for your generous support.

• Pastor Roger provided the following heading which incorporated the following items: *What is God Leading us to Do and What is God's Timing* 

> Pay off Debt Pre-School/Day Care/After School Tutoring New Sanctuary Family Pastor (Associate) Evening Praise and Prayer Services Community Outreach Events

Pastor Roger asked each Elder to consider and be in prayer with regards to the abovementioned items. He indicated that an evening praise and prayer service could possibly begin the early part of 2022. The service would be presented in a contemporary style of worship.

#### **Team Building**

Pastor Roger provided each Elder the opportunity to voice any items they may have with regards to their committees. He indicated that the Session is a team and we are here to be supportive of each other and each committee ministry. The following items were presented by Committee Chairpersons: **Long-Range Planning**: Scott Martin said it would be helpful for each committee to convey their ministry activities (current and projected) to the Long-Range Planning Committee ("LRP"). The committee could assist with ministry facilitation and implementation. Pastor Roger asked that Scott convey to the LRP Committee the items previously presented in this text under the heading of What is God Leading us to Do and What is God's Timing. *LRP Committee was removed as a standing Session committee in July of 2021. However, Pastor Roger believes that the committee is an integral component of church vision and achievement. Thus, it is the consensus of the Session that this committee will be reinstated as a standing Session committee.* 

**Christian Education Committee**: Kristy Stephenson conveyed that the committee is in need of volunteers to assist with committee ministries. Session will assist in this effort. As well, Pastor Roger indicated he could express this need during worship service.

**Financial Committee Report:** Sam Stephenson reviewed the October 2021 financial report and provided the following information:

- The mortgage balance is \$585,150.89. Money Market Savings balance is \$85,973.34. Bank Checking Account balance is \$99,732.40.
- Designated Fund book balance is \$86,219.05. General Fund book balance is \$225.01.
- Remaining 2020 Homecoming Offering balance is \$20,783.30.
- Development Fund balance is \$100.00 (\*As previously approved by the Session, the remaining balance in the Development Fund of \$100.00 will be applied to the principle of the mortgage)
- Transfer of \$7,000 was made from Homecoming Fund 2020 to the General Fund.
